Disrupting a meeting or procession. 20 (1) [A person is guilty of-] Terms defined in Section 76-1-101.5 apply to this section. 21 (2) An actor commits disrupting a meeting or procession if , intending to prevent or disrupt 22 a lawful meeting, procession, or gathering, he obstructs or interferes with] the actor, 23 acting intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly, prevents or substantially obstructs or 24 disrupts a lawful meeting, procession, or gathering by physical action, verbal utterance, 25 or any other means.]: (a)(i) using force, violence, or the threat of violence; or 26 27 (ii) engaging in another unlawful act, if the penalty for the unlawful act is a class B misdemeanor or higher; 28 (b) interfering with or preventing the ingress or egress to the physical facility where the 29 meeting, procession, or gathering is taking place, including through the use of 30

31	threatening language or actions that would put a reasonable person in fear of entering

33	(c) denying the use of the property or facility where the meeting, procession, or
34	gathering is taking place through the use of excessive sound.
35	[(2)] (3) [Disrupting a meeting or procession] A violation of Subsection (2) is a class B
36	misdemeanor.
37	Section 2. Effective Date.
