# 4 General Description:

5 This bill changes the allocation of money from a historical support special group license

6 plate.

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## **7 Highlighted Provisions:**

- 8 This bill:
- 9 allows an individual to request, for an additional fee, a set of two license plates;
- 10 allows a corporate brand sponsored special group license plate;
- 11 allows the consolidation of license plate types for purposes of meeting the minimum
- 12 circulation requirements;
- Provides the allocation of money from the voluntary contribution for a historical support
- special group license plate, allocating revenue to the sponsoring agency and to the
- 15 Transportation Investment Fund of 2005;
  - requires the Motor Vehicle Division to provide notice regarding the allocation of the money from the historical support special group license plate;
  - provides that a vintage vehicle is not required to make the voluntary contribution to obtain the historical support special group license plate;
- 20 allows contributions for collegiate special group license plates to be used for the
- 21 institution's compensation to student athletes for the use of the student athlete's name,
- 22 image, or likeness;
- 23 amends the definition of a vintage vehicle to exclude the requirement regarding the type
- of license plate to be displayed;
- requires the State Tax Commission to provide a report regarding special group license
- 26 plates; and
- 27 ► makes technical changes.

29	This bill appropriates \$3,500,000 in expendable funds and accounts for fiscal year 2026, all
30	of which is from the General Fund.
