28 **63G-7-102** . Definitions.

29	As used in this chapter:
30	(1) "Arises out of or in connection with, or results from," when used to describe the
31	relationship between conduct or a condition and an injury, means that:
32	(a) there is some causal relationship between the conduct or condition and the injury;
33	(b) the causal relationship is more than any causal connection but less than proximate
34	cause; and
35	(c) the causal relationship is sufficient to conclude that the injury originates with, flows
36	from, or is incident to the conduct or condition.
37	(2) "Claim" means any asserted demand for or cause of action for money or damages,
38	whether arising under the common law, under state constitutional provisions, or under
39	state statutes, against a governmental entity or against an employee in the employee's
40	personal capacity.
41	(3)(a) "Employee" includes:
42	(i)(A) a governmental entity's officers, employees, servants, trustees, or
43	commissioners; or
44	(B) an independent contractor of a municipality, if the independent contractor is a
45	law firm or attorney hired by the municipality to perform legal work related to
46	a governmental function on behalf of the municipality;
47	(ii) a member of a governing body;
48	(iii) a member of a government entity board;
49	(iv) a member of a government entity commission;
50	(v) members of an advisory body, officers, and employees of a Children's Justice
51	Center created in accordance with Section 67-5b-102;
52	(vi) a student holding a license issued by the State Board of Education;
53	(vii) an educational aide;
54	(viii) a student engaged in an internship under Section 53B-16-402 or 53G-7-902;
55	(ix) a volunteer, as defined in Section 67-20-2; [and] or
56	(x) a tutor.
57	(b) "Employee" includes all of the positions identified in Subsection (3)(a), whether or
58	not the individual holding that position receives compensation.
59	(c) ["Employee"] Except as provided in Subsection (3)(a)(i)(B), "employee" does not
60	include an independent contractor.
61	(4) "Governmental entity" means:
62	(a) the state and its political subdivisions; and

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63	(b) a law enforcement agency, as defined in Section 53-1-102, that employs one or more
64	law enforcement officers, as defined in Section 53-13-103.
65	(5)(a) "Governmental function" means each activity, undertaking, or operation of a
66	governmental entity.
67	(b) "Governmental function" includes each activity, undertaking, or operation performed
68	by a department, agency, employee, agent, or officer of a governmental entity.
69	(c) "Governmental function" includes a governmental entity's failure to act.
70	(6) "Injury" means death, injury to a person, damage to or loss of property, or any other
71	injury that a person may suffer to the person or estate, that would be actionable if
72	inflicted by a private person or the private person's agent.
73	(7) "Personal injury" means an injury of any kind other than property damage.
74	(8) "Political subdivision" means any county, city, town, school district, community
75	reinvestment agency, special improvement or taxing district, special district, special
76	service district, an entity created by an interlocal agreement adopted under Title 11,
77	Chapter 13, Interlocal Cooperation Act, or other governmental subdivision or public
78	corporation.
79	(9) "Property damage" means injury to, or loss of, any right, title, estate, or interest in real
80	or personal property.
81	(10) "State" means the state of Utah, and includes each office, department, division, agency,
82	authority, commission, board, institution, hospital, college, university, Children's Justice
83	Center, or other instrumentality of the state.
84	(11) "Willful misconduct" means the intentional doing of a wrongful act, or the wrongful
85	failure to act, without just cause or excuse, where the actor is aware that the actor's
86	conduct will probably result in injury.
87	Section 2. Section 63G-7-102.5 is enacted to read:
88	<u>63G-7-102.5</u> . Independent contractors.
89	The definition of an employee in Section 63G-7-102 as including an independent
90	contractor described in Subsection 63G-7-102(3)(a)(i)(B) does not have the effect of making
91	the independent contractor entitled to any seniority, status, benefits, insurance, salary,
92	minimum wage, overtime pay, workers' compensation, or tax-related withholding from the
93	municipality that hires the independent contractor.
94	Section 3. Effective Date.
95	This bill takes effect on May 7, 2025.
