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LONG TITLE

4 General Description:

This bill amends provisions relating to child care.

6 Highlighted Provisions:

- 7 This bill:
- 8 requires the Office of Child Care (office) to prepare and present an annual report on the
- 9 development and implementation of child care subsidies to certain legislative
- 10 committees;
- 11 provides that the Office of the Legislative Auditor General shall conduct an audit of the
- office for certain purposes; and
- 13 makes technical and conforming changes.

14 Money Appropriated in this Bill:

- This bill appropriates \$9,000,000 in operating and capital budgets for fiscal year 2026, all
- of which is from the General Fund.
- 17 Other Special Clauses:
- This bill provides a special effective date.

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- 23 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
- Section 1. Section **35A-3-209** is amended to read:
- 25 35A-3-209 . Award of child care subsidy services.
- 26 (1) As used in this section, "child care provider" means an entity that holds a license or
- 27 certificate from the Department of Health and Human Services in accordance with Title
- 28 26B, Chapter 2, Part 4, Child Care Licensing.
- 29 [(2)(a) On or before June 30, 2023, the office shall award a full child care subsidy or
- 30 grant for an income-eligible child.

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31	[(b) The office shall make the award described in Subsection (2)(a):]
32	[(i) in accordance with applicable federal law and regulation; and]
33	[(ii) subject to available funds.]
34	[(3)] (2)(a) [Beginning on July 1, 2023 and subject to Subsection (3)(b)] Subject to
35	Subsection (2)(b), the office may award:
36	(i) a full child care subsidy or grant for:
37	(A) an income-eligible child whose family income is equal to or below 75% of
38	state median income; or
39	(B) a child who has at least one parent or legal guardian working as a full-time
40	employee of a child care provider; and
41	(ii) a progressively lower child care subsidy or grant for each tenth of a percentage
42	point by which the income-eligible child's family income exceeds 75% of state
43	median income up to 85% of state median income.
44	(b) The office shall make the award described in Subsection $[(3)(a)]$ (2)(a):
45	(i) in accordance with applicable [federal law and regulation] state and federal laws;
46	and
47	(ii) subject to available state or federal funds.
48	(3) On or before November 1 of each year, the office shall prepare and present an annual
49	report on the development and implementation of this section to:
50	(a) the Economic Development and Workforce Services Interim Committee; and
51	(b) the Office of Child Care Advisory Committee as described in Section 35A-3-205.
52	(4)(a) Subject to prioritization by the Legislative Audit Subcommittee, the Office of the
53	Legislative Auditor General, shall, in any fiscal year, conduct an audit of the office's:
54	(i) financial operations;
55	(ii) compliance with this section; and
56	(iii) general performance.
57	(b) The Office of the Legislative Auditor General shall prepare and submit a written
58	report for an audit described in this section in accordance with Section 36-12-15.
59	[(4)(a) On or before June 30, 2023, and subject to Subsection (4)(b), the office shall
60	determine the amount of a child care subsidy or grant based on the income-eligible
61	child's enrollment in child care.]
62	[(b) To qualify for a child care subsidy or grant under Subsection (4)(a), an
63	income-eligible child shall be enrolled in child care for a minimum of eight hours per
64	month.

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65	[(c)] (5)(a) [On or after July 1, 2023, and subject] Subject to Subsection [(4)(d),] (5)(b),	
66	the office shall determine the amount of a child care subsidy or grant based on the	
67	income-eligible child's attendance in child care.	
68	[(d)] (b) To qualify for a child care subsidy or grant under Subsection $[(4)(c),]$ (5)(a), an	
69	income-eligible child shall attend child care for a minimum of eight hours per month.	
70	Section 2. FY 2026 Appropriation.	
71	The following sums of money are appropriated for the fiscal year beginning July 1,	
72	2025, and ending June 30, 2026. These are additions to amounts previously appropriated for	
73	fiscal year 2026.	
74	Subsection 2(a). Operating and Capital Budgets	
75	Under the terms and conditions of Title 63J, Chapter 1, Budgetary Procedures Act, the	
76	Legislature appropriates the following sums of money from the funds or accounts indicated for	
77	the use and support of the government of the state of Utah.	
78	ITEM 1 To Department of Workforce Services - Operations and Policy	
79	From General Fund, One-time 9,000,00)(
80	Schedule of Programs:	
81	Child Care Assistance 9,000,000	
82	The Legislature intends that the \$9,000,000	
83	provided in the Department of Workforce Services -	
84	Operation and Policy Line item for the Child Care	
85	Assistance Program from the General Fund be spent by	
86	the Office of Child Care Advisory Committee over the	
87	following years in the following amounts: FY 2026 -	
88	\$3,000,000; FY 2027 - \$3,000,000; and FY 2028 -	
89	\$3,000,000.	
90	Section 3. Effective Date.	
91	This bill takes effect on July 1, 2025.
