Senate Sponsor: 2 3 **LONG TITLE** 4 **General Description:** 5 This bill amends provisions related to historic preservation. 6 **Highlighted Provisions:** 7 This bill: 8 directs the State Historic Preservation Office (office) to conduct a statewide public 9 awareness media campaign to educate and inform the public on issues relating to 10 historic property; 11 requires the office to provide: 12 • seminars and training to agencies, organizations, and individuals on the preservation 13 and protection of state historic properties; and 14 • assistance to agencies, organizations, and individuals with applications for listing 15 historic property; and 16 makes technical changes. 17 **Money Appropriated in this Bill:** 18 None 19 **Other Special Clauses:** 20 None 21 **Utah Code Sections Affected:** 22 AMENDS: 23 **9-8a-203**, as last amended by Laws of Utah 2024, Chapter 323 24 25 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:* 26 Section 1. Section **9-8a-203** is amended to read: 27 9-8a-203. Office duties. 28 The office shall:

(1) secure, for the present and future benefit of the state, the protection of archaeological

resources and sites which are on state lands;

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(2) foster increased cooperation and exchange of information between state authorities, the
 professional archaeological community, and private individuals;
 in cooperation with federal and state agencies, local governments, private organizations,
 and private individuals, direct and conduct a comprehensive statewide survey of historic
 properties;

- 36 (4) maintain an inventory of the properties described in Subsection (3);
- 37 (5) identify and nominate eligible property to the National Register of Historic Places;
- 38 (6) administer applications for listing historic property on the National Register of Historic
- 39 Places;
- 40 (7) prepare and implement a comprehensive statewide historic preservation plan;
- 41 (8) administer the state program of federal assistance for historic preservation within the state;
- 43 (9) advise and assist, as appropriate, state agencies, federal agencies, and local governments 44 in carrying out [their] the state agency's, federal agency's, and local government's historic
- 45 preservation responsibilities;
- 46 (10) cooperate with federal agencies, state agencies, local agencies, private organizations,
- and individuals to ensure that historic property is taken into consideration at all levels of planning and development;

71	(b) enter into cooperative agreements with local governments and other groups and
72	organizations to collect and maintain the information needed for the inventory
73	described in Subsection $[(14)(a)]$ $(16)(a)$;
74	(c) encourage the use of volunteers to help collect the information and to maintain the
75	inventory described in Subsection [(14)(a);] (16)(a);
76	(d) encourage cemetery owners, or in the case of inactive or small historic cemeteries,
77	volunteers, to create and maintain geographic information systems to record burial
78	sites;
79	(e) publicize the information in the inventory described in Subsection [(14)(a)-] (16)(a) in
80	a variety of forms and media, especially to encourage Utah citizens to participate in
81	the care and upkeep of historic cemeteries;
82	(f) work with public and private cemeteries, heritage organizations, genealogical groups,
83	and volunteer groups to help maintain, repair, and landscape cemeteries, grave sites,
84	and tombstones; and
85	(g) make the inventory described in Subsection [(14)(a)-] (16)(a) available to any person
86	upon request;
87	[(15)] (17)(a) create and maintain a public electronic record of each cemetery location
88	and each burial location;
89	(b) help maintain, repair, and landscape cemeteries, grave sites, and tombstones by
90	providing matching grants to:
91	(i) municipal cemeteries;
92	(ii) cemetery maintenance districts;
93	(iii) endowment care cemeteries;
94	(iv) private nonprofit cemeteries;
95	(v) genealogical associations; or
96	(vi) other nonprofit groups with an interest in cemeteries; and
97	(c) make rules, in accordance with Title 63G, Chapter 3, Utah Administrative
98	Rulemaking Act, governing the process for awarding grants under Subsection (15)(b)

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99	including rules that ensure recipients use grant money for projects that are cost
100	effective and completed in accordance with applicable professional standards;
101	[(16)] (18) perform other duties as designated under 54 U.S.C. Sec. 302303; and
102	[(17)] (19) perform other duties as designated by the department and by statute.
103	Section 2. Effective Date.
