	Section 1. Section 53F-4-518 is amended to read:
	53F-4-518 . Small school student access to courses.
	Subject to legislative appropriations and Subsection 53F-4-514(2), and
	otwithstanding Subsections 53F-4-509(2) and (3), the state board shall:
(.) use funds from an appropriation for the Statewide Online Education Program to pay for
	an online course fee described in Section 53F-4-505 for a student who is enrolled in a
	public high school that enrolls fewer than 1,000 students;[-and]
(2	2) after the funds described in Subsection (1) have been expended, make a deduction as

33	(3) establish a prioritized funding distribution system that evaluates and ranks schools

35	(a) the school's demonstrated inability to provide courses, including Advanced
36	Placement, International Baccalaureate, or Concurrent Enrollment due to:

38	(ii) geographic isolation from qualified instructors;
