### **4** General Description:

- 5 This bill creates the Utah-Ireland Trade Commission within the Governor's Office of
- 6 Economic Opportunity.

## **7 Highlighted Provisions:**

- 9 creates the Utah-Ireland Trade Commission (trade commission) within the Governor's
- 10 Office of Economic Opportunity (office);
- describes the membership, purpose, and duties of the trade commission;
- provides that the office staff the trade commission;
- requires an annual report; and
- 14 authorizes the office to solicit funds for certain purposes and to account for those funds.

- Section 1. Section **63N-22-101** is enacted to read:

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CHAPTER 22. UTAH-IRELAND TRADE COMMISSION

29	63N-22-101 . Utah-Ireland Trade Commission Creation Membership
30	Chairs Terms Per diem and expenses.
31	(1) As used in this part, "trade commission" means the Utah-Ireland Trade Commission
32	created in this part.
33	(2) There is created in the office the Utah-Ireland Trade Commission.
34	(3) The trade commission membership consists of 11 members:
35	(a) six members to be selected as follows:
36	(i) three members from the House of Representatives, including:
37	(A) two selected by the speaker of the House of Representatives; and
38	(B) one selected by the speaker of the House of Representatives in consultation
39	with the minority leader of the House of Representatives;
40	(ii) three members from the Senate, including:
41	(A) two selected by the president of the Senate; and
42	(B) one selected by the president of the Senate in consultation with the minority
43	leader of the Senate; and
44	(b) five members to be appointed by the executive director of the office, including:
45	(i) two members from the office who shall oversee the following trade commission
46	activities in accordance with Section 63N-22-102:
47	(A) diplomatic relations; and
48	(B) coordination of office program resources to support the purpose described in
49	<u>Section 63N-22-102;</u>
50	(ii) two members of the World Trade Center, who shall oversee the following trade
51	commission activities:
52	(A) international programming; and
53	(B) trade promotion; and
54	(iii) one member from an institution of higher education, as that term is defined in
55	Section 53B-1-102.
56	(4)(a) Except as provided in Subsection (5), each member shall serve a two-year term.
57	(b) When a vacancy occurs for a member selected under Subsection (3)(a), the
58	replacement shall be selected for the unexpired term.
59	(c) The executive director shall, at the time of appointment or reappointment, adjust the
60	length of terms to ensure that the terms of these members are staggered so that
61	approximately half of the members are appointed or reappointed under Subsection (3)
62	every two years.

63	(d) When a vacancy occurs among members appointed by the executive director, the
64	replacement shall be appointed for the unexpired term.
65	(5) For a member appointed under Subsections (3)(b)(i) and (ii):
66	(a) one member from the office and one member from the World Trade Center shall
67	serve a one-year term; and
68	(b) one member from the office and one member from the World Trade Center shall
69	serve a two-year term.
70	(6) A majority of the trade commission members constitutes a quorum.
71	(7) The trade commission shall designate, by majority vote, a member as chair of the trade
72	commission.
73	(8)(a) State government officer and employee members who do not receive salary, per
74	diem, or expenses from the government officer's or employee's agency for service on
75	the trade commission may receive per diem and expenses at the rates incurred in the
76	performance of official trade commission duties at the rates established by the
77	Division of Finance under Sections 63A-3-106 and 63A-3-107.
78	(b) Legislators on the trade commission receive compensation and expenses as provided
79	by law and legislative rule.
80	(9) The office shall provide office space and administrative staff support for the trade
81	commission.
82	Section 2. Section <b>63N-22-102</b> is enacted to read:
83	$\underline{63N-22-102}$ . Purpose and duties of the trade commission Written report.
84	(1) The purpose of the trade commission shall be to:
85	(a) advance bilateral trade and investment between Utah and Ireland;
86	(b) initiate joint action on policy issues of mutual interest to Utah and Ireland;
87	(c) promote business and academic exchanges between Utah and Ireland;
88	(d) encourage mutual economic support between Utah and Ireland; and
89	(e) encourage mutual investment in the infrastructure of Utah and Ireland.
90	(2) The trade commission shall:
91	(a) maintain active communication with:
92	(i) the office of the United States trade representative;
93	(ii) Utah's state trade representative or state point of contact, if created; and
94	(iii) any other organization whose mission involves international trade in the United
95	States as the trade commission considers appropriate; and
96	(b) have no more than four paid meetings per year.

97	(3) Beginning in 2026, and no later than July 1 of each year, the trade commission shall	
98	issue a written report to the governor and the Economic Development and Workforce	
99	Services Interim Committee regarding the trade commission's activities in the preceding	
100	year and any recommendations to further trade and good relations between Utah and	
101	<u>Ireland.</u>	
102	Section 3. Section 63N-22-103 is enacted to read:	
103	63N-22-103. Solicitation of funds.	
104	(1) The office shall be authorized to raise funds as described in this section to:	
105	(a) defray administrative expenses; and	
106	(b) carry out the trade commission's purposes.	
107	(2) The office may:	
108	(a) raise funds through direct solicitation or other fund-raising events, alone or with	
109	other groups; and	
110	(b) accept gifts, grants, and bequests from individuals, corporations, foundations,	
111	governmental agencies, and public and private organizations and institutions.	
112	(3) The office shall maintain and separately account for the funds received and expended	
113	under this section.	
114	Section 4. FY 2026 Appropriations.	
115	The following sums of money are appropriated for the fiscal year beginning July 1,	
116	2025, and ending June 30, 2026. These are additions to amounts previously appropriated for	
117	fiscal year 2026.	
118	Subsection 4(a). Operating and Capital Budgets	
119	Under the terms and conditions of Title 63J, Chapter 1, Budgetary Procedures Act, the	
120	Legislature appropriates the following sums of money from the funds or accounts indicated for	
121	the use and support of the government of the state of Utah.
