31	(1) "Artificial intelligence" means a machine-based system that can, for a given set of
32	human-defined objectives, make predictions, recommendations, or decisions influencing

34	(2) "Generative artificial intelligence" means artificial intelligence technology that is
35	capable of creating content such as text, audio, image, or video based on patterns learned
36	from large volumes of data rather than being explicitly programmed with rules.

40	(1)(a) A law enforcement agency shall have a policy concerning the use of generative
41	artificial intelligence by employees of the law enforcement agency in the course and
42	scope of the law enforcement agency's work.
43	(b) The policy described in Subsection (1)(a) shall:
44	(i) include the requirements described in Subsection (2); and
45	(ii) provide employees of the law enforcement agency with information concerning
46	the use of generative artificial intelligence, including:
