25	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
26	Section 1. Section 36-36-101 is enacted to read:
27	CHAPTER 36. LEGISLATIVE EDUCATION EVALUATION COMMISSION
28	<u>36-36-101</u> . Definitions.
29	As used in this chapter, "commission" means the Legislative Education Evaluation
30	Commission.

31	Section 2. Section 36-36-102 is enacted to read:
32	36-36-102 . Legislative Education Evaluation Commission created.
33	(1) There is created the Legislative Education Evaluation Commission to:
34	(a) study education-related issues in the state;
35	(b) consider education-related issues that stakeholders bring to the commission;
36	(c) propose education-related legislation; and
37	(d) make recommendations regarding education issues in the state.
38	(2) The commission membership shall include:
39	(a) four members of the Senate, whom the president of the Senate appoints, no more
40	than three of whom may be from the same political party, including:
41	(i) the cochair of the Higher Education Appropriations Subcommittee;
42	(ii) the cochair of the Public Education Appropriations Subcommittee; and
43	(iii) the cochair of the Education Interim Committee;
44	(b) four members of the House of Representatives, whom the speaker of the House of
45	Representatives appoints, no more than three of whom may be from the same
46	political party, including:
47	(i) the cochair of the Higher Education Appropriations Subcommittee;
48	(ii) the cochair of the Public Education Appropriations Subcommittee; and
49	(iii) the cochair of the Education Interim Committee; and
50	(c) subject to Subsection (2)(b), members, whom the Legislative Management
51	Committee appoints, from a list the cochairs of the commission described in
52	Subsection (5) recommended, including:
53	(i) the state superintendent or the state superintendent's designee;
54	(ii) four elected members of the State Board of Education;
55	(iii) the commissioner of higher education or the commissioner's designee;
56	(iv) one member of a local school board;
57	(v) one district superintendent; and
58	(vi) one public school teacher.
59	(3)(a) The Legislative Management Committee shall appoint or reappoint the members
60	described in Subsection (2)(c) to a two-year term.
61	(b) When a vacancy occurs in the membership for any reason, the Legislative
62	Management Committee, in consultation with the cochairs of the commission, shall
63	appoint a replacement for the unexpired term in accordance with the membership
64	requirement for the vacant position described in Subsection (3)(a).

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65	(4) The president of the Senate and the speaker of the House of Representatives shall, to the
66	extent possible, appoint members under Subsections (2)(a) and (b) that represent both
67	rural and urban areas of the state.
68	(5)(a) The president of the Senate shall designate a member of the Senate appointed
69	under Subsection (2)(a) as a cochair of the commission.
70	(b) The speaker of the House of Representatives shall designate a member of the House
71	of Representatives appointed under Subsection (2)(b) as a cochair of the commission.
72	(6)(a) Except as provided in Subsection (6)(b), Legislative Joint Rules, Title 7, Chapter
73	1, Part 2, Creation and Organization of Legislative Committees, governs quorum
74	requirements for the commission.
75	(b) The commission may not include members of the commission described in
76	Subsection (2)(c) for purposes of:
77	(i) determining a quorum; or
78	(ii) counting votes toward an action of the commission.
79	(7)(a) Compensation and expenses of a member of the commission who is a legislator
80	are governed by Section 36-2-2 and Legislative Joint Rules, Title 5, Legislative
81	Compensation and Expenses.
82	(b) A commission member who is an employee of the state may not receive
83	compensation in addition to the member's regular state compensation for the
84	member's service on the commission.
85	(c) A commission member who is not descried in Subsection (7)(a) or (b) may not
86	receive compensation or expenses for the member's service on the commission.
87	(8) The commission may create one or more subcommittees to advise the commission on
88	any issue related to education.
89	(9) The Office of Legislative Research and General Counsel shall provide staff support to
90	the commission.
91	Section 3. Section 36-36-103 is enacted to read:
92	<u>36-36-103</u> . Duties and powers of commission.
93	(1) The commission shall:
94	(a) consider and make recommendations to the Education Interim Committee, the Public
95	Education Appropriations Subcommittee, and the Higher Education Appropriations
96	Subcommittee on the following issues:
97	(i) education issues stakeholders raise, from stakeholders including:
98	(A) the State Board of Education;

99	(B) the Utah Board of Higher Education;
100	(C) an institution of higher education listed in Section 53B-1-102;
101	(D) local education agencies as defined in Section 53E-1-102; and
102	(E) members of the Legislature;
103	(ii) proposed education-related legislation as the commission cochairs determine;
104	(iii) findings and recommendations from legislative audits regarding education;
105	(iv) potential legislation for consideration by the Education Interim Committee; and
106	(v) other education issues of statewide importance as the commission cochairs
107	determine; and
108	(b) consult with the stakeholders listed in Subsection 36-36-102(3)(a)(i) to fulfill the
109	commission's duties under this section.
110	(2) <u>The commission may:</u>
111	(a) meet up to six times per calendar year without approval from the Legislative
112	Management Committee; and
113	(b) make a recommendation to the Education Interim Committee on potential committee
114	legislation.
