Mr. President,

The Judiciary, Law Enforcement, and Criminal Justice Committee recommends **2nd Sub. H.B. 209**, HOMESCHOOL AMENDMENTS, by Representative N. P. Peck, be replaced and reports a favorable recommendation on **3rd Sub. H.B. 209**, HOMESCHOOL AMENDMENTS with the following amendments:

- 1. Page Line 7 through 9:
 - 7 This Bill:
 - 8 → clarifies when { a letter of intent } <u>notification</u> to homeschool is required from parents;
 - 9 →removes the requirement for parents to submit an affidavit for students who begin
- 2. Page Line 152 through 154:
 - 152 (4)A local school board may not require a notification described in Subsection (3) if <u>a</u>
 - 153 parent of <u>a</u> school-age child provided a notification to the local school board on or <u>before</u>
 - 154 May, 7 2025, including through a home-school affidavit.
- 3. Page Line 156 through 159:

157 (i)maintain a record of the {letter of intent } notification ; and
158 (ii)acknowledge receipt of the {letter } notification to the parent within 30 days; and
