The Health and Human Services Committee reports a favorable recommendation on **H.C.R. 2**, CONCURRENT RESOLUTION DIRECTING PEHP REGARDING PHARMACEUTICAL REBATES, by Representative N. K Thurston, with the following amendments:

- 1. Page Line 4 through 7:
 - 4 {Committee Note: }
 - 5 { The Retirement and Independent Entities Interim Committee recommended this bill. }
 - 6 { Legislative Vote: 8 voting for 0 voting against 7 absent }
 - 7 General Description:
- 2. Page Line 39 through 44:
 - 39 <u>high-cost health care needs who purchase rebate-paying drugs needs to end;</u>
 - 40 <u>WHEREAS, this financial burden amounts to about</u> {2.8} <u>two</u> <u>million dollars in</u> <u>costs for those</u>
 - 41 <u>members that purchase rebate-paying drugs;</u>
 - 42 WHEREAS, if that financial burden were to be spread across the total membership of
 - 43 the state risk pool, the cost would equal about {\$3.81} <u>\$2.84</u> per member per month; and
 - 44 <u>WHEREAS</u>, this change will provide relief to state employees and their family members

- 53 members by increasing the member premium share or reducing the state's health savings
- 54 <u>account contribution.</u> <u>BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that PEHP optimize the total value of PEHP's</u> <u>pharmacy benefit manager contract through monitoring, updating, and rebidding.</u>
