 - (14) (a) In relation to the manual candidate qualification process, if an individual signs a signature packet for more than one candidate nomination petition for the same office, and the signatures are valid, the election officer shall only verify the signature in the signature packet that the election officer receives earliest.
 - (b) In relation to the electronic candidate qualification process, if an individual signs more than one candidate nomination petition for the same office, and the signatures are valid, the election officer shall only verify the signature that the election officer receives earliest.
