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**LONG TITLE**

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**General Description:**

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This bill makes technical corrections regarding certain criminal offenses.

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**Highlighted Provisions:**

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This bill:

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- corrects a cross reference concerning the criminal offense of prohibited conduct in the sale of a dangerous weapon;

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- corrects subsection numbering errors in the criminal offense of sexual battery;

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- amends the criminal offense of distributing material harmful to minors to include a

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penalty provision that was inadvertently omitted from a technical recodification bill in

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the 2025 General Session and makes additional technical corrections to the penalty

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provisions of the criminal offense;

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- revises the criminal offense of public assistance fraud by a recipient of public assistance

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by amending the name of the offense and correcting a citation;

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- updates the names of criminal offenses for patterns of unlawful activity; and

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- makes technical and conforming changes.

46 (5)(a) "Qualified civil liability action" means a civil action or proceeding or an  
47 administrative proceeding brought by any person against a manufacturer or seller of a  
48 qualified product, or a trade association, for damages, punitive damages, injunctive or  
49 declaratory relief, abatement, restitution, fines, or penalties, or other relief, resulting  
50 from the criminal or unlawful misuse of a qualified product by the person or a third  
51 party.

52 (b) "Qualified civil liability action" does not include:

53 (i) an action brought against a transferor convicted under 18 U.S.C. Sec. 924(h) or

69 or having reasonable cause to believe, that the actual buyer of the qualified  
70 product was prohibited from possessing or receiving a firearm or ammunition  
71 under 18 U.S.C. Sec. 922(g) or (n) or Title 76, Chapter 11, Part 3, Persons  
72 Restricted Regarding Dangerous Weapons;
- 73 (iv) an action for breach of contract or warranty in connection with the purchase of  
74 the product;
- 75 (v) an action for death, physical injuries, or property damage resulting directly from a  
76 defect in design or manufacture of the product, when used as intended or in a  
77 reasonably foreseeable manner, except that where the discharge of the product  
78 was caused by a volitional act that constituted a criminal offense, then the act shall  
79 be considered the sole proximate cause of any resulting death, personal injuries, or  
80 property damage; or
- 81 (vi) an action or proceeding commenced to enforce the provisions of 18 U.S.C.  
82 Chapter 44, 26 U.S.C. Chapter 53, or Title 76, Chapter 11, Weapons.
- 83 (6) "Qualified product" means a firearm or antique firearm, as defined in Section 76-11-101,  
84 ammunition, or a component part of a firearm or ammunition.
- 85 (7) "Seller" means, with respect to a qualified product, a federal firearms licensee, as

- 87 (8) "Trade association" means:
- 88 (a) any corporation, unincorporated association, federation, business league, or  
89 professional or business organization not organized or operated for profit and no part  
90 of the net earnings of which inures to the benefit of any private shareholder or

101 (2) An actor commits sexual battery if, under circumstances not amounting to an offense  
 102 described in Subsection (4)[, ~~the actor~~]:

103 (a) the actor intentionally touches, whether or not through clothing:

104 (i) the anus, buttocks, or any part of the genitals of another individual; or

105 (ii) [~~or~~]the breast of a female individual; and

106 [(iii)] (b) the actor's conduct is under circumstances that the actor knows or should know  
 107 will likely cause affront or alarm to the individual touched.

108 (3) A violation of Subsection (2) is a class A misdemeanor.

123 (1) Terms defined in Sections 76-1-101.5, 76-5c-101, and 76-5c-201 apply to this section.

124 (2) An actor commits distributing material harmful to minors if the actor:

125 (a)(i) intentionally distributes or offers to distribute, or exhibits or offers to exhibit,  
 126 material harmful to minors to an individual;

127 (ii) intentionally produces, performs, or directs any performance, before an individual  
 128 that is harmful to minors; or

129 (iii) intentionally participates in a performance before an individual that is harmful to

- 130 minors; and
- 131 (b)(i) knows or believes the individual described in Subsection (2)(a) is a minor; or
- 132 (ii) negligently fails to determine if the individual described in Subsection (2)(a) is a
- 133 minor and the individual is a minor.
- 134 (3)(a) Except as provided in Subsection [~~(3)(b)~~] (3)(b)(iii), [~~(e), (d), or (e),~~] a violation of
- 135 Subsection (2) is a second degree felony if the actor is 18 years old or older and has
- 136 previously been convicted or adjudicated of a violation of Subsection (2) and is

- 138 (i) a minimum mandatory fine of not less than \$5,000, plus \$10 for each article
- 139 exhibited up to the maximum allowed by law; and

189 (iii) the hosting company does not knowingly receive from or through a person who  
190 distributes the pornographic material a fee greater than the fee generally charged

- 210 (2) An actor commits public assistance fraud [~~by a recipient of~~] relating to obtaining or using
- 211 public assistance if the actor:
- 212 (a)(i) except as provided in Subsection (2)(b), is receiving public assistance
- 213 administered by a state agency; and
- 214 (ii) intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly fails to disclose to the state agency
- 215 administering the public assistance to the actor of a change of a material fact

274 of commission, or otherwise are interrelated by distinguishing characteristics. Taken  
275 together, the episodes shall demonstrate continuing unlawful conduct and be related  
276 either to each other or to the enterprise. At least one of the episodes comprising a  
277 pattern of unlawful activity shall have occurred after July 31, 1981. The most recent act  
278 constituting part of a pattern of unlawful activity as defined by this part shall have  
279 occurred within five years of the commission of the next preceding act alleged as part of  
280 the pattern.

282 in property, including state, county, and local governmental entities.

283 (4) "Unlawful activity" means to directly engage in conduct or to solicit, request, command,
