23 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:*

24 Section 1. Section **63A-17-110** is amended to read:

25 **63A-17-110. State pay plans for DNR law enforcement officers and wildland firefighters.**

30 (1) As used in this section:

31 (a) "Division of Forestry, Fire, and State Lands" means the division created in Section 65A-1-4 within
the Department of Natural Resources.

33 (b) "Division of Law Enforcement" means the division created in Section 79-2-702 within the
Department of Natural Resources.

35 (c) "DNR law enforcement officer" means an employee of the Department of Natural Resources who is
designated as a law enforcement officer by law.

37 (d) "Wildland firefighter" means an employee of the Division of Forestry, Fire, and State Lands who is:
39 (i) trained in firefighter techniques; and
40 (ii) assigned to a position of hazardous duty.

41 (2) The director shall:

42 (a) coordinate directly with the Division of Forestry, Fire, and State Lands and the Division of Law
Enforcement to establish specialized state pay plans for DNR law enforcement officers and wildland

established for each DNR law enforcement officer under Subsektion (2)(a)(ii) shall be equivalent
to the salary range and proposed pay progression of a peace officer employed by the Department of
Public Safety with similar years of service and qualifications.} }

65 {(b) } {The executive director of the Department of Natural Resources, in consultation with the
director of the Division of Law Enforcement, may reduce the salary range and proposed pay
progression that would otherwise be established, under Subsektion (2)(a)(ii) and (3)(a), for the rank
of major or for division director within the Division of Law Enforcement, to ensure that the salary
range and proposed pay progression for those positions do not exceed the salary range and proposed
pay progression of directors of other divisions within the Department of Natural Resources.} }
