## LONG TITLE

### **General Description:**

This bill addresses the salary range and proposed pay progression for law enforcement officers within the Department of Natural Resources (DNR).

## Highlighted Provisions:

This bill:

- requires that the salary range and proposed pay progression for law enforcement officers employed by the DNR be equivalent to the average salary range and pay progression for:

- **peace officers employed by the Department of Corrections; and**

- { requires that the salary range and proposed pay progression for law enforcement officers employed by the DNR be equivalent to the salary range and pay progression for } peace officers employed by the Department of Public Safety;

- ▶ provides an exception to the requirement described in the preceding paragraph in relation to the rank of major and the position of division director in the DNR; and

- ▶ makes technical changes.

26 Section 1. Section **63A-17-110** is amended to read:

27 **63A-17-110. State pay plans for DNR law enforcement officers and wildland firefighters.**

28 (1) As used in this section:

29 (a) "Division of Forestry, Fire, and State Lands" means the division created in Section 65A-1-4 within  
the Department of Natural Resources.

31 (b) "Division of Law Enforcement" means the division created in Section 79-2-702 within the  
Department of Natural Resources.

33 (c) "DNR law enforcement officer" means an employee of the Department of Natural Resources who is  
designated as a law enforcement officer by law.

36 (d) "State average law enforcement salary range and progression" means the sum of the following,  
divided by two:

38 (i) the salary range and proposed pay progression for a peace officer with similar years of service and  
qualifications who is employed by the Department of Corrections and has arrest authority; and

41 (ii) the salary range and proposed pay progression for a peace officer with similar years of service and

- (a) coordinate directly with the Division of Forestry, Fire, and State Lands and the Division of Law Enforcement to establish specialized state pay plans for DNR law enforcement officers and wildland firefighters that:
- 43 (i) [meets] meet the requirements of Section 63A-17-307;
- 44 (ii) [distinguishes] subject to Subsection (3), establish the salary range and proposed pay progression for each DNR [peaee] law enforcement officer;
- 46 (iii) [distinguishes] establish the salary range for each wildland firefighter classification;
- 48 (iv) [includes] include for each DNR law enforcement officer and wildland firefighter classification:
- 50 (A) the minimum qualifications; and
- 51 (B) any training requirements; and

- 63 (b) The executive director of the Department of Natural Resources, in consultation with the director of the Division of Law Enforcement, may reduce the salary range and proposed pay progression that would otherwise be established, under Subsections (2)(a)(ii) and (3)(a), for the rank of major or for division director within the Division of Law Enforcement, to ensure that the salary range and proposed pay progression for those positions do not exceed the salary range and proposed pay progression of directors of other divisions within the Department of Natural Resources.
