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LONG TITLE

General Description:

This bill amends provisions regarding electric assisted bicycles and other devices.

Highlighted Provisions:

This bill:

- defines terms;
- clarifies that the definition of motorcycle includes a motorcycle being powered by an electric or combustion engine;
- makes it unlawful to consume alcohol while operating an electric assisted bicycle;
- addresses tampering with or modifying equipment beyond the manufacturer's original settings on electric assisted bicycle or motorcycle;
- **{subjects electric bicycles to impound for violations;}**
- requires that {individuals} an individual under 21 years old {shall} must wear {helmets} a met while operating {electric assisted bicycles} certain devices on a highway;
- **allows a peace officer to hold an individual's electric vehicle and release it to a parent if the**
peace officer observes a violation and the individual is under 18 years old.

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16 ▶ creates a safety course for the operation of certain electric devices on a highway and describes
17 the circumstances under which the course is required; and
18 ▶ makes technical changes.
