3 **LONG TITLE**

4 **General Description:**

5 This bill amends provisions related to cannabinoid (hemp) products.

6 **Highlighted Provisions:**

7 This bill:

- 8 ▶ {**modifies the definition of cannabinoid product;**}
- 9 ▶ amends provisions related to hazardous waste and hemp disposal;
- 10 ▶ requires industrial hemp retailers to check an individual's identification to ensure a purchaser is at least 21 years old;
- 12 ▶ repeals video surveillance requirements; and
- 13 ▶ amends provisions related to unlawful acts.

As used in this chapter:
