4 **General Description:**

5 This bill amends provisions related to kratom. {-}

6 **Highlighted Provisions:**

7 This bill:

- 8 ▶ defines terms;
- 9 ▶ requires a kratom processor and kratom retailer to register with the Department of
10 Agriculture and Food;
- 11 ▶ only allows a retail tobacco specialty business to sell kratom;
- 11 ▶ ~~{repeals}~~ bans the ~~{Kratom Consumer Protection Act}~~ sale of certain kratom products; ~~{and}~~
- 13 ▶ amends provisions related to penalties and fees;
- 14 ▶ amends the age for who can purchase a kratom product;
- 12 ▶ schedules ~~{alkaloids found in or derived from kratom}~~ 7-hydroxymitragynine, including
15 synthetics, if the 7-hydroxymitragynine concentration exceeds a certain percentage as a schedule I
16 controlled ~~{substances.}~~ substance; and
- 17 ▶ schedules Mitragynine pseudoindoxyl, including synthetics.
