3 **LONG TITLE**

4 **General Description:**

5        This bill adjusts the ~~{attorney general's}~~ governor's salary.

6 **Highlighted Provisions:**

7        This bill:

- 8            ▶ beginning July 1, 2026, sets the salary of the ~~{attorney general}~~ governor equal to the total annual compensation of the chief justice of the Supreme Court; and
- 10           ▶ makes technical changes.

14        This bill provides a special effective date.

## SB0235 compared with SB0235S01

19 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:*

20 Section 1. Section **67-22-1** is amended to read:

21 **67-22-1. Compensation -- Constitutional offices.**

(a) The salary for the governor shall be ~~[set annually by the Legislature in an appropriations act]~~ equal to the salary of the chief justice of the Supreme Court, plus the additional compensation provided to the chief justice under Subsection 78A-3-101(3)(g).

24 (b) ~~{[Constitutional]}~~ Except as provided in Subsection (1)(c), constitutional } office salaries shall be based on the following percentages of the salary of the governor:

26 (i) lieutenant governor: 90% of the governor's salary;

27 ~~{(ii) attorney general: 95% of the governor's salary;}~~

38 (iv) household expenses;

39 (v) retirement benefits as provided in Title 49, Utah State Retirement and Insurance Benefit Act;

41 (vi) health insurance;

43 (viii) basic life insurance;

44 (ix) workers' compensation;

45 (x) required employer contribution to Social Security;

46 (xi) long-term disability income insurance; and

47 (xii) the same additional state paid life insurance available to other noncareer service employees; and

49 (b) lieutenant governor, attorney general, state auditor, and state treasurer:

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- 50 (i) a vehicle for official and personal use;
- 51 (ii) the option of participating in a:

- 55 (II) Chapter 13, Public Employees' Noncontributory Retirement Act; or
- 56 (III) Chapter 22, New Public Employees' Tier II Contributory Retirement Act; or
- 58 (B) deferred compensation plan administered by the State Retirement Office, in accordance with the  
Internal Revenue Code and its accompanying rules and regulations;

- 62 (iv) dental insurance;
- 63 (v) basic life insurance;
- 64 (vi) workers' compensation;
- 65 (vii) required employer contribution to Social Security;
- 66 (viii) long-term disability income insurance; and
- 67 (ix) the same additional state paid life insurance available to other noncareer service employees.
- 69 (3) Each constitutional office shall pay the cost of the additional state-paid life insurance for its  
constitutional officer from its existing budget.
