3. Enforcement

187 (1) The division shall administer and enforce the provisions of this chapter in accordance with Chapter
188 2, Division of Consumer Protection.

189 (2) In addition to the division's enforcement powers under Chapter 2, Division of Consumer Protection,
190 the division may:

191 (a) impose an administrative fine of up to \$2,500 for a violation of this chapter; and

192 (b) bring an action in a court with jurisdiction to enforce a provision of this chapter.
