4 **General Description:**

5 This bill creates the Gold Medal Schools Pilot Program.

6 **Highlighted Provisions:**

- 14 ▶ creates a reporting requirement;
- 17 ▶ creates a cap for administrative costs associated with the program;

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- 15 ▶ creates a sunset date for the program; and
16 ▶ makes technical and conforming changes.
