4 **General Description:**

5 This bill enacts provisions relating to {~~limitations on liability for~~} punitive damages.

6 **Highlighted Provisions:**

30 [(2)] (b) loss of an election;

31 [(3)] (c) the penal consequences of a crime; or

32 [(4)] (d) punitive damages.

33 (2) An insurer may not consider, use, or rely upon the existence, likelihood, possibility, or exposure to punitive damages when engaging in any of the following under this title:

41 **(1) Except as provided in Subsection (2), in an action where a plaintiff seeks punitive damages against an employer or principal based solely on the negligent conduct of an employee or agent, the**

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employer or principal may not be held vicariously liable for punitive damages based solely on the agency or employment relationship.

45 (2) To obtain an award of punitive damages against an employer or principal based solely on the
conduct of an employee or agent, a plaintiff shall demonstrate by clear and convincing evidence
that:

48 (a) the employer's or principal's conduct was willful, malicious, or in reckless disregard to the rights or
safety of others; or

50 (b) the employer or principal authorized, ratified, or approved of the alleged conduct that gave rise to
the claim.
