

Brady Brammer proposes the following substitute bill:

Tribal Endorsement of Utah Driver License Amendments

2026 GENERAL SESSION

STATE OF UTAH

LONG TITLE

General Description:

This bill allows an applicant for a driver license to request a notation on the driver license or identification card indicating that the individual is an enrolled member of a federally recognized Indian tribe.

Highlighted Provisions:

This bill:

- defines terms;
- allows an applicant to request a notation of "Federally Recognized Tribal Member" on the driver license or identification card indicating that the individual is an enrolled member of a federally recognized Indian tribe;
- instructs the Driver License Division regarding satisfactory proof that an applicant is an enrolled member of a federally recognized Indian tribe; and
- prohibits the notation from identifying a specific Indian tribe.

Money Appropriated in this Bill:

This bill appropriates \$192,900 in operating and capital budgets for fiscal year 2026, all of which is from the various sources as detailed in this bill.

Other Special Clauses:

This bill provides a special effective date.

Utah Code Sections Affected:

ENACTS:

53-3-237 (Effective 01/01/27), Utah Code Annotated 1953

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

Section 1. Section **53-3-237** is enacted to read:

53-3-237 (Effective 01/01/27). Driver license notation of tribal membership.

- 29 (1) As used in this section:
- 30 (a) "Bureau of Indian Affairs affidavit of birth" or "tribal affidavit of birth" means an
31 affidavit of birth issued by the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs that includes:
- 32 (i) the individual's name;
33 (ii) the individual's date of birth; and
34 (iii) other identifying information.
- 35 (b) "Enhanced tribal card" means a tribal identification card that:
- 36 (i) is issued by a federally recognized Indian tribe;
37 (ii) meets the requirements established by the United States Department of Homeland
38 Security for use as an acceptable document to denote identity and citizenship; and
39 (iii) includes enhanced security features.
- 40 (c) "Federally recognized Indian tribe" means an Indian tribe recognized and included
41 on the list required by 25 U.S.C. Sec. 5131.
- 42 (d) "Tribal certificate of Indian blood" means a certificate issued by the United States
43 Bureau of Indian Affairs that:
- 44 (i) certifies the degree of Indian blood of an individual; and
45 (ii) verifies the individual's enrollment or eligibility for enrollment in a federally
46 recognized Indian tribe.
- 47 (e) "Tribal identification card" means an identification card issued by a federally
48 recognized Indian tribe that includes:
- 49 (i) the individual's name;
50 (ii) the individual's date of birth;
51 (iii) a photograph of the individual; and
52 (iv) the name of the issuing tribe.
- 53 (2) An applicant may, as part of the application process described in Section 53-3-205 or
54 53-3-804, request a notation on the applicant's individual license certificate or
55 identification card indicating that the individual is an enrolled member of a federally
56 recognized Indian tribe.
- 57 (3) The division shall accept the following as satisfactory proof that the applicant is an
58 enrolled member of a federally recognized Indian tribe:
- 59 (a) an enhanced tribal card;
60 (b) a tribal identification card;
61 (c) a tribal certificate of Indian blood; or
62 (d) a tribal or Bureau of Indian Affairs affidavit of birth.

63 (4)(a) If the applicant provides satisfactory proof as described in Subsection (3), the
 64 division shall include on the individual's license certificate or identification card a
 65 notation of "Federally Recognized Tribal Member."

66 (b) The notation may not identify a specific Indian tribe or other specific personal
 67 information that is submitted on the documents that provide satisfactory proof that
 68 the person is an enrolled member of a federally recognized Indian tribe.

69 **Section 2. FY 2026 Appropriations.**

70 The following sums of money are appropriated for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
 71 2025, and ending June 30, 2026. These are additions to amounts previously appropriated for
 72 fiscal year 2026.

73 **Subsection 2(a). Operating and Capital Budgets**

74 Under the terms and conditions of Title 63J, Chapter 1, Budgetary Procedures Act, the
 75 Legislature appropriates the following sums of money from the funds or accounts indicated for
 76 the use and support of the government of the state of Utah.

77 **ITEM 1 To Department of Public Safety - Driver License**

78 From Department of Public Safety Restricted Account,

79 One-time 192,900

80 Schedule of Programs:

81 Driver License Administration 192,900

82 The Legislature intends that Driver License
 83 Division spend the appropriation under Item 1 to update
 84 the driver license format to accommodate the notation
 85 described in Section 53-3-237.

86 **Section 3. Effective Date.**

87 (1) Except as provided in Subsection (2), this bill takes effect July 1, 2026.

88 (2) The actions affecting Section 53-3-237 (Effective 01/01/27) take effect on January 1,
 89 2027.
