Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

30 Section 1. Section **53F-5-601** is amended to read:

32	As used in this part:
33	(1) "American Indian and [Alaskan] Alaska Native concentrated school" means a school
34	where at least 29% of the school's students are American Indian or [Alaskan] Alaska
35	Native.
36	(2) "Native American Legislative Liaison Committee" means the committee created in
37	Section 36-22-1.
38	(3) "State plan" means the American Indian and Alaska Native education state plan adopted
39	under [Laws of Utah 2015, Chapter 53, Section 7] Section 53F-5-605.

41	required to hold an educator license issued by the state board and who has an assignment
42	to teach in a classroom.

45	(1)(a) In addition to the state plan[-adopted under Laws of Utah 2015, Chapter 53,
46	Section 7], beginning with fiscal year 2020-2021, there is created a program
47	administered by the state board to provide grants targeted to address the needs of
48	American Indian and [Alaskan] Alaska Native students.
49	(b) The program shall consist of a grant program to school districts and charter schools
50	to be used to fund materials, books, supplies, local and national conferences,
51	stipends, recruitment, retention, and professional development of teachers who teach
52	in American Indian and [Alaskan] Alaska Native concentrated schools.
53	(c) In determining grant recipients for at least two-thirds of the money appropriated to

Section 5. Effective Date.
This bill takes effect on May 6, 2026.
