38	(2)(a) Except as provided in Subsection (2)(b), an individual may not operate a vehicle
39	to which a cargo carrier is attached on a highway if the cargo carrier obscures,
40	obstructs, or blocks a required tail light such that the tail light is not clearly visible
41	from a distance of 500 feet to the rear of the vehicle.
42	(b) An individual may operate a vehicle as described in Subsection (2)(a) if the
43	individual installs auxiliary lighting equipment or reflectors in accordance with
44	Subsection (3).
45	(3)(a) If an individual operates a vehicle on a highway with a cargo carrier that obscures,
46	obstructs, or blocks a tail light, the individual shall install auxiliary lighting
47	equipment or reflectors installed as described in Subsection (3)(b).
48	(b) An individual required to install auxiliary lighting or reflectors required under
49	Subsection (3)(a) shall:
50	(i) mount or attach the auxiliary light or reflector onto the cargo carrier;
51	(ii) if auxiliary lighting equipment is installed, ensure that the auxiliary lighting:
52	(A) is wired to activate simultaneously with the vehicle's standard tail lights and
53	brake lights;
54	(B) is red in color and visible from a distance of at least 500 feet to the rear; and
55	(iii) meet or exceed the standards established by the Department of Public Safety

57	(c) if reflectors are installed, ensure that the reflectors:
58	(i) are red in color;
59	(ii) are visible from a distance of at least 500 feet to the rear when illuminated by the
