**LONG TITLE**

**General Description:**

This bill addresses when a government entity is required to provide an electronic filing option to a person submitting information to the government entity.

**Highlighted Provisions:**

This bill:

- defines terms;
- requires state and local government to provide an electronic option for filling out forms and for submitting forms, records, and other information; and
- provides certain exceptions or delays to the requirement described in the preceding paragraph.

**Other Special Clauses:**

This bill provides a special effective date.

Section 1. Section **11-72-101** is enacted to read:

**CHAPTER 72. Local Government - Interaction with Citizens and Others**

**11-72-101 . Definitions.**

29 As used in this chapter:

30 (1) "Incarcerated individual" means an individual who is confined in a prison, jail, or other  
31 correctional facility.

32 (2) "Local government" means a political subdivision of the state, including:

33 (a) a county, city, town, school district, special district, or special service district;

34 (b) an agency or office of a political subdivision of the state; or

35 (c) an official or employee of:

36 (i) a political subdivision of the state; or

37 (ii) an entity described in Subsection (2)(a) or (b).

38 Section 2. Section **11-72-102** is enacted to read:

39 **11-72-102 . Electronic submission of forms, records, and other information.**

40 (1) Except as provided in Subsection (2) or (3), and subject to Subsection (4), if a local  
41 government requires or requests a person to submit a form, a record, or information to  
42 the local government, the local government shall, instead of requiring the person to  
43 appear in person or otherwise provide a physical copy of the form, the record, or  
44 information, provide an electronic means for the person to submit the form, record, or  
45 information, which may include, at the discretion of the local government:

46 (a) electronically completing and electronically signing the form;

47 (b) downloading the form, completing and physically or electronically signing the form,  
48 and submitting a copy of the completed and signed form electronically, by email or  
49 other electronic means;

50 (c) entering the information online;

51 (d) uploading the completed and signed form, the record, or the information; or

52 (e) sending the record or information by email or other electronic means.

53 (2) Subsection (1) does not apply:

54 (a) to the extent prohibited by an express provision of:

55 (i) federal law or rule;

56 (ii) state law; or

57 (iii) court rule;

58 (b) to the extent that the person is required by state or federal law to fill out the form in  
59 person or to submit the form, record, or information in person;

60 (c) if the person is required to submit a fingerprint with the form, record, or information:

61 (i) by state or federal law; or

62 (ii) for the purpose of conducting a criminal background check;

- 63 (d) if the person is an incarcerated individual;  
 64 (e) to a marriage license, if the local government requires an individual to be present to  
 65 obtain a marriage license; or  
 66 (f) to a form, record, or information relating to an election governed by Title 20A,  
 67 Election Code.
- 68 (3)(a) Until January 1, 2030, Subsection (1) does not apply to a local government with  
 69 an annual fiscal year that:
- 70 (i) has annual revenue of \$1,000,000 or less; or  
 71 (ii) has annual expenditures of \$1,000,000 or less.
- 72 (b) Until July 1, 2030, Subsection (1) does not apply to a local government, with a fiscal  
 73 year other than a calendar fiscal year, that:
- 74 (i) has annual revenue of \$1,000,000 or less; or  
 75 (ii) has annual expenditures of \$1,000,000 or less.
- 76 (4) Subsection (1) applies regardless of whether the purpose of the requirement or request is

84 As used in this chapter:

- 85 (1) "Incarcerated individual" means an individual who is confined in a prison, jail, or other  
 86 correctional facility.
- 87 (2)(a) "State government" means:
- 88 (i) a branch of state government;  
 89 (ii) a department, agency, or other entity of state government;  
 90 (iii) an independent entity, as defined in Section 63E-1-102; or  
 91 (iv) an official or employee of an entity described in Subsections (1)(a) through (c).
- 92 (b) "State government" does not include local government, as defined in Section  
 93 11-72-101.

94 Section 4. Section **63G-34-102** is enacted to read:

95 **63G-34-102 . Electronic submission of forms, records, and other information.**

- 96 (1) Except as provided in Subsection (2), and subject to Subsection (3), if state government

97 requires or requests a person to submit a form, a record, or information to state  
98 government, state government shall, instead of requiring the person to appear in person  
99 or otherwise provide a physical copy of the form, the record, or information, provide an  
100 electronic means for the person to submit the form, record, or information, which may  
101 include, at the discretion of state government:

102 (a) electronically completing and electronically signing the form;

103 (b) downloading the form, completing and physically or electronically signing the form,  
104 and submitting a copy of the completed and signed form electronically, by email or  
105 other electronic means;

106 (c) entering the information online;

107 (d) uploading the completed and signed form, the record, or the information; or

108 (e) sending the record or information by email or other electronic means.

109 (2) Subsection (1) does not apply:

110 (a) to the extent prohibited by an express provision of:

111 (i) federal law or rule;

112 (ii) state law; or

114 (b) to the extent that the person is required by state or federal law to fill out the form in

118 (ii) for the purpose of conducting a criminal background check;

119 (d) if the person is an incarcerated individual;

120 (e) in relation to a notarized document, if state government requires the person to submit  
121 the original notarized document; or

122 (f) to a form, record, or information relating to an election governed by Title 20A,  
123 Election Code.

124 (3) Subsection (1) applies regardless of whether the purpose of the requirement or request is  
125 to:

126 (a) comply with a requirement of law;

127 (b) request a service or thing; or

128 (c) request or compel government action or forbearance.

129 **Section 5. Effective Date.**
