6                   **LONG TITLE**

7                   **General Description:**

8                   This bill amends provisions regarding ambulance provider payments.

9                   **Highlighted Provisions:**

10                  This bill:

- 11                  ▸ defines terms;
- 12                  ▸ amends provisions related to the base rate;
- 13                  ▸ authorizes the Bureau of Emergency Medical Services to adjust the base rate each year;
- 14                  ▸ amends the base rate to include the cost of medicine;
- 15                  ▸ allows an ambulance provider to collect up to the base rate and mileage rate;
- 16                  ▸ repeals sunset dates; and
- 17                  ▸ makes technical changes.

71 (1) As used in this section:

72 (a)(i) "Balance bill" means the practice of a health care provider billing an individual  
73 for the difference between the individual's billed charges and the amount the  
74 individual's health benefit plan allows for a covered service.

75 (ii) "Balance bill" does not include [billing]:

76 (A) billing an uninsured individual for services provided;  
77 (B) [an individual for the difference of the amount allowed by a health benefit  
78 plan for a billed service and the amount paid by the health benefit plan for the  
79 billed service; and] if an individual's health benefit plan or other health  
80 insurance does not allow the total of the base rate and the mileage rate as an  
81 allowable expense, billing the individual for the total of the following:

82 (I) the base rate plus the mileage rate; and

83 (II) subtracting the amount actually paid by the health benefit plan or other  
84 third party; and

85 (C) billing an individual for a service that was denied by the health benefit plan  
86 because the service was an uncovered service under the health benefit plan.

87 (b)(i) "Base rate" means the rate described in Subsection (5)(a) that a ground  
88 ambulance provider charges for:

89 (A) transporting an individual to a hospital or patient receiving facility;  
90 (B) supplies used when transporting the individual;  
91 (C) providing procedures during transport; [and]  
92 (D) administering medications during transport[.]; and  
93 (E) the cost of medication.

94 (ii) "Base rate" includes an adjusted rate published by the bureau in rule in  
95 accordance with Subsection (2)(b).

96 [({iii}) (iii) "Base rate" does not include charges for[.] mileage.

(c) "Medical care consumer price index" means the unadjusted 12-month medical services rate published each December by the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics to measure inflation.

[e] "Medication maximum cost" means a cost for a medication that equals the lower of the:]

[*(i)* national average drug acquisition cost; and]

[**(ii)** Utah maximum allowable cost established in the Utah Medicaid program.]

(2)(a) The bureau shall establish a maximum mileage rate for ground ambulance providers and paramedic providers that is just and reasonable.

(b) In accordance with Title 63G, Chapter 3, Utah Administrative Rulemaking Act, on or before May 1 of each year, the bureau shall publish an adjusted base rate for each transport type in rule.

(c) The bureau shall adjust the base rate published under Subsection (2)(b) to be the total of the currently operative base rate multiplied by the medical care consumer price index.

(d) The bureau may not adjust the base rate more than once each calendar year.

(3) The committee may make recommendations to the bureau on the maximum mileage rate set under Subsection (2).

(4)(a) Ground ambulance providers and paramedic providers may not charge fees for transporting a patient when the provider does not transport the patient.

(b) The provisions of Subsection (4)(a) do not apply to ambulance providers or paramedic providers in a geographic service area which contains a town as defined in Subsection 10-2-301(2)(f).

(5)(a) [The] Subject to adjustments published in rule under Subsection (2)(b), the base rate is as follows:

(i) for emergency medical technician ground ambulance transport, [\$1,234.92]  
\$1,257.15;

(ii) for advanced emergency medical technician ground ambulance transport, [ \$1,630.31] \$1,659.66;

(iii) for paramedic ground ambulance transport, ~~[\$2,383.73]~~ [\$2,426.64]; and

(iv) subject to Subsection (5)(b), for a transport described in Subsection (5)(a)(i) or

(ii) that has a paramedic on board, ~~[\$2,383.73]~~ [\$2,426.64].

131 (b) A ground ambulance provider may charge the rate described in Subsection (5)(a)(iv)  
132 if:  
133 (i) a designated emergency medical service dispatch center dispatches a licensed  
134 paramedic provider to treat the individual;  
135 (ii) the licensed paramedic provider has initiated advanced life support;  
136 (iii) online medical control directs that a paramedic remain with the patient during  
137 transport; and  
138 (iv) the licensed ground ambulance provider has a reimbursement for paramedic  
139 services agreement with a paramedic licensed provider for the service provided.

140 (6)(a) For the mileage rate established in rule under this section, a ground ambulance  
141 provider or paramedic provider may not charge an amount greater than the amount  
142 authorized in the rule setting the mileage rate.

143 (b) For the base rate, a ground ambulance provider or paramedic provider may not  
144 charge an amount greater than the base rate [described in Subsection (5)(a) for  
145 transportation] for services covered under the base rate.

146 [(c) For a medication, a ground ambulane provider or paramedic provider may not  
147 charge an amount greater than the medication maximum cost for a provided  
148 medication.]

149 (7) A ground ambulance provider or paramedic provider may not balance bill.
