LONG TITLE**General Description:**

This bill modifies the day on which Juneteenth National Freedom Day is recognized in Utah.

Highlighted Provisions:

This bill:

- ▶ provides that June 19, called Juneteenth National Freedom Day, is a legal holiday in Utah;
- ▶ consistent with other legal holidays in Utah, provides for recognition of Juneteenth National Freedom Day on the preceding Friday or subsequent Monday if the holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday, respectively; and
- ▶ amends parent-time schedules in relation to Juneteenth National Freedom Day.

Other Special Clauses:

This bill provides a special effective date.

25 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:*

26 Section 1. Section **63G-1-301** is amended to read:

27 **63G-1-301 . Legal holidays -- Personal preference day -- Governor authorized to**
28 **declare additional legal holidays.**

29 (1) The following days are legal holidays in Utah:

30 (a) except as provided in Subsection [(2)(a) or (b)] (2):

- (i) January 1, New Year's Day;
- (ii) June 19, Juneteenth National Freedom Day;
- [(iii) (iii) July 4, Independence Day;
- [(iv)] (iv) July 24, Pioneer Day;
- [(v)] (v) November 11, Veterans Day;
- [(vi)] (vi) December 25, Christmas; and
- [(vii)] (vii) a day designated by proclamation issued by the president of the United States or the governor as a day of fasting or thanksgiving;

(b)(i) the first Sunday after the first full moon that occurs on or after the spring equinox, Easter Sunday;

(ii) the third Monday of January, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day;

(iii) the third Monday of February, Washington and Lincoln Day;

(iv) the last Monday of May, Memorial Day;

(v) the first Monday of September, Labor Day;

(vi) the second Monday of October, Columbus Day; and

(vii) the fourth Thursday of November, Thanksgiving Day; and

[(viii) except as provided in Subsection (2)(c) or (d), June 19, Juneteenth National Freedom Day; and]

(c) except as provided in Subsection (3), every Sunday.

(a) If a day described in Subsection (1)(a) falls on a Saturday, the preceding Friday is the legal holiday.

(b) If a day described in Subsection (1)(a) falls on a Sunday, the following Monday is the legal holiday.

[(c) If June 19 falls on a Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, or Friday, the preceding Monday is the legal holiday.]

[(d) If June 19 falls on Saturday or Sunday, the following Monday is the legal holiday.]

For purposes of Utah Constitution, Article VI, Section 16, Subsection (1), regarding the exclusion of state holidays from the 45-day legislative general session, Sunday is not considered a state holiday.

Each employee may select one additional day, called Personal Preference Day, to be scheduled in accordance with rules made, in accordance with Title 63G, Chapter 3, Utah Administrative Rulemaking Act, by the Division of Human Resource Management, which the employee may use to observe a state holy day, as described in Section 63G-1-1101, or any other day the employee chooses to recognize.

65 (5)(a) If, in the governor's opinion, extraordinary conditions exist justifying the action,
66 the governor may:
67 (i) declare, by proclamation, legal holidays in addition to those legal holidays
68 described in Subsections (1) and (2); or

79 **81-9-302 . Minimum schedule for parent-time for a minor child five to 18 years**

80 **old.**

81 (1) The parent-time schedule in this section applies to a minor child who is five to 18 years
82 old.

83 (2) If the parties do not agree to a parent-time schedule for a minor child described in
84 Subsection (1), the following schedule is considered the minimum parent-time to which
85 the noncustodial parent is entitled to the minor child:
86 (a)(i) one weekday evening to be specified by the noncustodial parent or the court or
87 Wednesday evening if not specified, beginning at 5:30 p.m. and ending at 8:30
88 p.m.; or
89 (ii) at the election of the noncustodial parent, one weekday to be specified by the
90 noncustodial parent or the court:
91 (A) beginning at the time that the minor child's school is regularly dismissed and
92 ending at 8:30 p.m.; or
93 (B) if school is not in session, the noncustodial parent is available to be with the
94 minor child, and in accommodation with the custodial parent's work schedule,
95 beginning at 9 a.m. and ending at 8:30 p.m.;
96 (b)(i) beginning on the first weekend after entry of the decree, alternating weekends
97 beginning at 6 p.m. on Friday and ending on Sunday at 7 p.m.; or
98 (ii) at the election of the noncustodial parent and beginning on the first weekend after

99 the entry of the decree, alternating weekends:

100 (A) beginning at the time that the minor child's school is regularly dismissed on
101 Friday and ending on Sunday at 7 p.m.; or
102 (B) if school is not in session, the noncustodial parent is available to be with the
103 minor child, and in accommodation with the custodial parent's work schedule,
104 beginning on Friday at 9 a.m. and ending on Sunday at 7 p.m.;

105 (c) each holiday granted to the noncustodial parent in accordance with the holiday
106 schedule described in Subsection (12); and
107 (d) extended parent-time with the minor child when school is not in session for summer
108 break in accordance with Subsection (3).

109 (3)(a) For extended parent-time with the minor child under Subsection (2)(d) and at the
110 election of the noncustodial parent, the noncustodial parent is entitled up to four
111 weeks of parent-time with the minor child, which may be consecutive, when school is
112 not in session for summer break.

113 (b) For the four weeks of extended parent-time for a noncustodial parent under
114 Subsection (3)(a):

115 (i) two weeks, which may be consecutive, shall be uninterrupted parent-time for the
116 noncustodial parent; and
117 (ii) two weeks, which may be consecutive, may be interrupted by the custodial parent
118 for a weekday visit on the same day on which the noncustodial parent is granted
119 weekday day parent-time.

120 (c) A custodial parent is entitled to uninterrupted parent-time with the minor child for
121 two weeks, which may be consecutive, when school is not in session for summer
122 break.

123 (4)(a) Each parent shall provide notification to the other parent of the parent's plans for
124 the exercise of extended parent-time for summer break under Subsection (3).

125 (b) For the notification requirement under Subsection (4)(a):

126 (i) in odd-numbered years:
127 (A) the noncustodial parent shall provide notice to the custodial parent by May 1;
128 and
129 (B) the custodial parent shall provide notice to the noncustodial parent by May 15;
130 and
131 (ii) in even-numbered years:
132 (A) the custodial parent shall provide notice to the noncustodial parent by May 1;

133 and

134 (B) the noncustodial parent shall provide notice to the custodial parent by May 15.

135 (c)(i) If a parent fails to provide a notification within the time periods described in
136 Subsection (4)(b), the complying parent may determine the schedule for summer
137 break for the noncomplying parent.

138 (ii) If both parents fail to provide notice within the time periods described in
139 Subsection (4)(b), the first parent to provide notice may determine the schedule
140 for summer break for the other parent.

141 (d) If a custodial parent intends to interrupt a noncustodial parent's parent-time under
142 Subsection (3)(b)(ii), the custodial parent shall provide notification to the
143 noncustodial parent of the intent to interrupt parent-time within 10 days after the day
144 on which the custodial parent receives notification of the noncustodial parent's plans
145 for the exercise of interrupted extended parent-time.

146 (5)(a) An election should be made by the noncustodial parent at the time of entry of the
147 divorce decree or court order, except that the election may be changed by mutual
148 agreement, court order, or by the noncustodial parent in the event of a change in the
149 minor child's schedule.

150 (b) An election by either parent concerning parent-time shall be made a part of the
151 decree and made a part of the parent-time order.

152 (6)(a) Changes may not be made to the parent-time schedule under this section, except
153 that if a conflict arises in the parent-time schedule, the following order of precedence
154 shall be applied when determining which parent is entitled to parent-time:

155 (i) the holiday schedule for Mother's Day or Father's Day under Subsection (12);
156 (ii) the holiday schedule for the minor child's birthday, unless a parent is exercising
157 uninterrupted extended parent-time under Subsection (3) and takes the minor child
158 away from that parent's residence during the uninterrupted extended parent-time;
159 (iii) the holiday schedule for any holiday under Subsection (12) that is not Father's
160 Day, Mother's Day, or the minor child's birthday;
161 (iv) extended parent-time under Subsection (3); and
162 (v) the schedule for weekday or weekend parent-time.

163 (b) A parent exercising parent-time for the minor child's birthday may bring other
164 siblings along for the minor child's birthday.

165 (7) A stepparent, grandparent, or other responsible adult designated by the noncustodial
166 parent, may pick up the minor child for parent-time if the custodial parent is aware of

167 the identity of the individual and the noncustodial parent will be with the minor child by
168 7 p.m.

169 (8) If a holiday falls on a regularly scheduled school day, the parent exercising parent-time
170 shall be responsible for the minor child's attendance at school for that school day.

171 (9) If there is more than one minor child and the minor children's school schedules vary for
172 purpose of a holiday, at the option of the parent exercising the holiday or the parent's
173 half of the holiday, the minor children may remain together for the holiday period
174 beginning the first evening that all minor children's schools are dismissed for the holiday
175 and ending the evening before any minor child returns to school.

176 (10)(a) Telephone contact shall be at reasonable hours and for a reasonable duration.

177 (b)(i) Virtual parent-time, if the equipment is reasonably available and the parents
178 reside at least 100 miles apart, shall be at reasonable hours and for reasonable
179 duration.

180 (ii) If the parties cannot agree on whether the equipment is reasonably available, the
181 court shall decide whether the equipment for virtual parent-time is reasonably
182 available, taking into consideration:

183 (A) the best interests of the minor child;

184 (B) each parent's ability to handle any additional expenses for virtual parent-time;
185 and

186 (C) any other factors the court considers material.

187 (c) Virtual parent-time supplements, but does not replace, in-person parent-time.

188 (11) If there is a minor child five to 18 years old and a minor child under five years old and
189 both minor children are the children of the parties, the parents and the court should
190 consider an upward deviation for parent-time with all the minor children so that
191 parent-time is uniform based on a schedule under this section.

192 (12) The following table is the holiday schedule for parent-time under this section.

214 **81-9-303 . Optional schedule for parent-time for a minor child five to 18 years**

215 **old.**

216 (1)(a) The optional parent-time schedule in this section applies to a minor child who is five to 18 years old.

217 (b) For purposes of calculating child support, the optional parent-time schedule in this section is 145 overnights.

218 (c) Any impact on child support shall be consistent with joint physical custody.

219 (2) The parents and the court may consider the increased parent-time schedule in this section as a minimum parent-time schedule when the parties agree or the noncustodial parent can demonstrate:

220 (a) the noncustodial parent has been actively involved in the minor child's life;

221 (b) the parties can communicate effectively regarding the minor child or the

noncustodial parent has a plan to accomplish effective communications regarding the minor child;

- (c) the noncustodial parent has the ability to facilitate the increased parent-time;
- (d) the increased parent-time would be in the best interest of the minor child; and
- (e) any other factor the court considers relevant.

(3) In determining whether a noncustodial parent has been actively involved in the minor child's life, the court shall consider:

- (a) demonstrated responsibility in caring for the minor child;
- (b) involvement in childcare;
- (c) presence or volunteer efforts in the minor child's school and at extracurricular activities;
- (d) assistance with the minor child's homework;
- (e) involvement in preparation of meals, bath time, and bedtime for the minor child;
- (f) bonding with the minor child; and
- (g) any other factor the court considers relevant.

(4) In determining whether a noncustodial parent has the ability to facilitate the increased parent-time, the court shall consider:

- (a) the geographic distance between the residences of the parents and the distance between the parents' residences and the minor child's school;
- (b) the noncustodial parent's ability to assist with after school care;
- (c) the health of the minor child and the noncustodial parent in accordance with Subsection 81-9-204(4);
- (d) flexibility of employment or another schedule of the noncustodial parent;
- (e) ability to provide appropriate playtime with the minor child;
- (f) history and ability of the noncustodial parent to implement a flexible schedule for the minor child;
- (g) physical facilities of the noncustodial parent's residence; and
- (h) any other factor the court considers relevant.

(5) If the parties agree or the court enters an order for the optional parent-time schedule under this section, a parenting plan in compliance with Section 81-9-203 shall be filed with any order incorporating the optional parent-time schedule described in Subsection (6).

(6) The following schedule is considered the optional parent-time to which the noncustodial parent is entitled to the minor child:

458 (ii) virtual parent-time, if the equipment is reasonably available and the parents reside
459 at least 100 miles apart, at reasonable hours and for reasonable duration.

460 (b) If the parties cannot agree on whether the equipment is reasonably available, the

court shall decide whether the equipment for virtual parent-time is reasonably available, taking into consideration:

- (i) the best interests of the minor child;
- (ii) each parent's ability to handle any additional expenses for virtual parent-time; and
- (iii) any other factors the court considers appropriate.

(c) Virtual parent-time supplements, but does not replace, in-person parent-time.

(11) For a minor child who is younger than nine months old, unless the parents agree otherwise, parent-time should take place in the home of the custodial parent, an established child-care setting, or other environment familiar to the minor child.

(12)(a) Changes may not be made to the parent-time schedule under this section, except that if a conflict arises in the parent-time schedule, the following order of precedence shall be applied when determining which parent is entitled to parent-time:

(i) the holiday schedule for Mother's Day or Father's Day under Subsection (15);

(ii) the holiday schedule for the minor child's birthday, unless a parent is exercising uninterrupted extended parent-time under Subsection (7)(d), (8)(d), or (9) and takes the minor child away from that parent's residence during the uninterrupted extended parent-time;

(iii) the holiday schedule for any holiday under Subsection (15) that is not Father's Day, Mother's Day, or the minor child's birthday;

(iv) extended parent-time under Subsection (7)(d), (8)(d), or (9); and

(v) the schedule for weekday or weekend parent-time.

(b) A parent exercising parent-time for the minor child's birthday may bring other siblings along for the minor child's birthday.

(13) If a holiday falls on a regularly scheduled school day, the parent exercising parent-time shall be responsible for the minor child's attendance at school for that school day.

(14) A parent shall notify the other parent at least 30 days in advance of the parent's plans for the exercise of extended parent-time under Subsection (7)(d), (8)(d), or (9).
