 3 **LONG TITLE**

4 **General Description:**

5 This bill prohibits certain non-disclosure agreements between prospective data centers and
 6 state and local governments.

7 **Highlighted Provisions:**

8 This bill:

- 9 ▶ defines terms;
- 10 ▶ prohibits state agencies, cities, towns, and counties from entering into non-disclosure
- 11 agreements with prospective data centers;
- 12 ▶ provides that prohibited non-disclosure agreements are void and unenforceable;
- 13 ▶ requires severability of void provisions from other contract terms; and
- 14 ▶ requires public disclosure of prohibited non-disclosure agreements.

 25 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:*

26 Section 1. Section **10-8-95** is enacted to read:

27 **10-8-95 . Non-disclosure agreements with prospective data centers -- Prohibitions**
 28 **-- Public disclosure.**

29 (1) As used in this section:

30 (a) "Agent" means an individual or entity acting on behalf of a municipality.

- 31 (b) "Data center" means a facility that:
32 (i) is designed or used to house computer servers and associated components,
33 including data storage devices, networking equipment, and telecommunications
34 infrastructure; and
35 (ii) has a connected electrical load capacity of 20 megawatts or greater.
- 36 (c) "Non-disclosure agreement" means a contract, agreement, or understanding, whether
37 written or oral, that contains any provision, clause, or language that:
38 (i) provides that the contract, agreement, or understanding, or any of the contract's,
39 agreement's, or understanding's terms, is confidential; or
40 (ii) prohibits a municipality or the municipality's agent from disclosing, discussing,
41 describing, or commenting upon information related to a prospective data center.
- 42 (d) "Prospective data center" means a proposed data center that:
43 (i) has not yet received all necessary approvals, permits, or authorizations from the
44 municipality to commence construction or operation; or
45 (ii) is in the process of negotiating with or seeking approvals from the municipality.
- 46 (2) A municipality or an agent of a municipality may not enter into a non-disclosure
47 agreement with a prospective data center on or after the effective date of this section.
- 48 (3)(a) A non-disclosure agreement that violates Subsection (2) is void and unenforceable.
- 49 (b) If a contract contains a provision that is void and unenforceable under Subsection
50 (3)(a):
51 (i) the provision shall be severed from the other provisions of the contract to the
52 extent that the provision is void and unenforceable; and
53 (ii) the remaining provisions of the contract remain enforceable.
- 54 (4) A municipality shall publicly disclose a contract or agreement that violates Subsection
55 (2) by:
56 (a) posting the contract or agreement on the municipality's website within 30 days after
57 the day on which:
58 (i) the municipality enters into the contract or agreement; or
59 (ii) a court determines that the contract or agreement violates this section; and
60 (b) maintaining the posted contract or agreement on the municipality's website for at
61 least five years after the day on which the contract or agreement is posted.
- 62 (5) A resident of a municipality may bring an action in district court to:
63 (a) obtain a declaratory judgment that a non-disclosure agreement violates this section
64 and is void;

- 65 (b) enjoin the enforcement of a non-disclosure agreement that violates this section; or
66 (c) compel a municipality to comply with the public disclosure requirement in
67 Subsection (4).

68 Section 2. Section **17-60-509** is enacted to read:

69 **17-60-509 . Non-disclosure agreements with prospective data centers --**

70 **Prohibitions -- Public disclosure.**

71 (1) As used in this section:

72 (a) "Agent" means an individual or entity acting on behalf of a county.

73 (b) "Data center" means a facility that:

74 (i) is designed or used to house computer servers and associated components,
75 including data storage devices, networking equipment, and telecommunications
76 infrastructure; and

77 (ii) has a connected electrical load capacity of 20 megawatts or greater.

78 (c) "Non-disclosure agreement" means a contract, agreement, or understanding, whether
79 written or oral, that contains any provision, clause, or language that:

80 (i) provides that the contract, agreement, or understanding, or any of the contract's,
81 agreement's, or understanding's terms, is confidential; or

82 (ii) prohibits a county or the county's agent from disclosing, discussing, describing, or
83 commenting upon information related to a prospective data center.

84 (d) "Prospective data center" means a proposed data center that:

85 (i) has not yet received all necessary approvals, permits, or authorizations from the
86 county to commence construction or operation; or

87 (ii) is in the process of negotiating with or seeking approvals from the county.

88 (2) A county or an agent of a county may not enter into a non-disclosure agreement with a
89 prospective data center on or after the effective date of this section.

90 (3)(a) A non-disclosure agreement that violates Subsection (2) is void and unenforceable.

91 (b) If a contract contains a provision that is void and unenforceable under Subsection
92 (3)(a):

93 (i) the provision shall be severed from the other provisions of the contract to the
94 extent that the provision is void and unenforceable; and

95 (ii) the remaining provisions of the contract remain enforceable.

96 (4) A county shall publicly disclose a contract or agreement that violates Subsection (2) by:

97 (a) posting the contract or agreement on the county's website within 30 days after the
98 day on which:

- 99 (i) the county enters into the contract or agreement; or
 100 (ii) a court determines that the contract or agreement violates this section; and
 101 (b) maintaining the posted contract or agreement on the county's website for at least five
 102 years after the day on which the contract or agreement is posted.
 103 (5) A resident of a county may bring an action in district court to:
 104 (a) obtain a declaratory judgment that a non-disclosure agreement violates this section
 105 and is void;
 106 (b) enjoin the enforcement of a non-disclosure agreement that violates this section; or
 107 (c) compel a county to comply with the public disclosure requirement in Subsection (4).

108 Section 3. Section **63G-2-109** is enacted to read:

109 **63G-2-109 . Non-disclosure agreements with prospective data centers prohibited.**

110 (1) As used in this section:

- 111 (a) "Agent" means an individual or entity acting on behalf of a state agency.
 112 (b) "Data center" means a facility that:
 113 (i) is designed or used to house computer servers and associated components,
 114 including data storage devices, networking equipment, and telecommunications
 115 infrastructure; and
 116 (ii) has a connected electrical load capacity of 20 megawatts or greater.
 117 (c) "Non-disclosure agreement" means a contract, agreement, or understanding, whether
 118 written or oral, that contains any provision, clause, or language that:
 119 (i) provides that the contract, agreement, or understanding, or any of the contract's,
 120 agreement's, or understanding's terms, is confidential; or
 121 (ii) prohibits a state agency or the state agency's agent from disclosing, discussing,
 122 describing, or commenting upon information related to a prospective data center.
 123 (d) "Prospective data center" means a proposed data center that:
 124 (i) has not yet received all necessary approvals, permits, or authorizations from the
 125 state agency to commence construction or operation; or
 126 (ii) is in the process of negotiating with or seeking approvals from the state agency.

127 (2)(a) A state agency or an agent of a state agency may not enter into a non-disclosure
 128 agreement with a prospective data center.

129 (b) Subsection (2)(a) applies to non-disclosure agreements entered into on or after the
 130 effective date of this section.

131 (3)(a) A non-disclosure agreement that violates Subsection (2) is void and unenforceable.

132 (b) If a contract contains a provision that is void and unenforceable under Subsection

133 (3)(a), that provision shall be severed from the other provisions of the contract to the
134 extent that the provision is void and unenforceable.

135 (c) The fact that a provision is void and unenforceable under Subsection (3)(a) does not
136 affect the enforceability of the other provisions of the contract.

137 (4) A state agency shall publicly disclose any contract or agreement that violates Subsection
138 (2) by:

139 (a) posting the contract or agreement on the state agency's website within 30 days after
140 the day on which:

141 (i) the state agency enters into the contract or agreement; or

142 (ii) a court determines that the contract or agreement violates this section; and

143 (b) maintaining the posted contract or agreement on the state agency's website for at
144 least five years after the day on which the contract or agreement is posted.

145 (5) A resident of this state may bring an action in district court to:

146 (a) obtain a declaratory judgment that a non-disclosure agreement violates this section
147 and is void;

148 (b) enjoin the enforcement of a non-disclosure agreement that violates this section; or

149 (c) compel a state agency to comply with the public disclosure requirement in
150 Subsection (4).

151 Section 4. **Effective Date.**

152 This bill takes effect on May 6, 2026.
