

Issue Brief – Educator Licensing Fees

STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION – OFFICE OF EDUCATION

SUMMARY

The Legislature, through the Educator Licensing and Professional Practices Act, established that “the high quality of teachers is absolutely essential to enhance student achievement and to assure education excellence in each classroom in the state’s public schools.” The Legislature has established a method of charging licensing fees for educators, ensuring that educators meet and maintain “high standards both as to qualifications and fitness for service as educators.”¹

OBJECTIVE

This brief provides information on the regulatory fees charged to educators in Utah to obtain a license and a proposed FY 2007 fee schedule submitted by the State Office of Education.

DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

Through intent language passed in the 2004 General Session, the Legislature requested that the State Board of Education submit an educator licensing fee plan that provided enough revenue to support the costs of the USOE – Educator Licensing Section. Statute requires that educators seeking licensure in Utah be charged a fee and statute requires that these fees cover the expenses of issuing these licenses. By passing this intent language, the Legislature reaffirmed the statutes that require educator licensing, collecting a fee for these licenses, and the sufficient generation of fee revenue to cover costs.

Statute Requires Fees

The Educator Licensing and Professional Practices Act states that “the board shall levy a fee for each new, renewed, or reinstated license or endorsement”² issued in the state. During the 2004 General Session, the Legislature amended statute to include charging fees for renewed licenses. The statute was amended to ensure that the State Office of Education could charge for renewed licenses. The statutory clarification for renewal fees provides the fee capacity necessary for the USOE to operate educator licensing without the use of Uniform School Funds.

Statute Requires Fee Revenue Cover Expenses

The Budgetary Procedures Act requires that “Each fee agency shall: (a) adopt a schedule of fees assessed for services provided by the fee agency that are: (i) reasonable, fair and reflect the cost of services provided.”³ Due to this statute, subsidizing Educator Licensing with state revenue may be in conflict with state law.

Educator licensing fee revenue is credited to the Professional Practices Restricted Subfund in the Uniform School Fund. The State Board of Education “shall pay the expenses of issuing licenses and of UPPAC (Utah Professional Practices Advisory Commission) operations, and the costs of collecting license fees from the restricted subfund.”⁴

Analyst Response: Indicators suggest that the revenue collected from the various educator licensing fees, approved by the Legislature and charged by the State Office of Education, are not being deposited into the Professional Practices Restricted Subfund in the Uniform School Fund as statute dictates. This situation is being reviewed and may result in some adjustment to the USOE budget in a subsequent appropriations act this session in order to correct for fee revenue sources that are currently defined as dedicated credits.

FY 2007 Educator Licensing Requests

Teacher Quality – the USOE has identified that revenues from licensing fees are insufficient to support the teacher quality functions of the Educator Licensing Section. Among other tasks, teacher quality specialists work with the State’s Higher Education institutions to ensure the quality of new teachers and oversee the Early Years Enhancement Program.

The State Board of Education has requested \$113,000 in ongoing Uniform School Fund revenue to support these teacher quality functions. USOE anticipates that this program will run a deficit in FY 2007 without a state appropriation, fee increase, or program reduction. Further, USOE has argued that

Recommendation: The Analyst recommends that the subcommittee closely scrutinize these requests by the State Office of Education. As stated above, the Legislature has made the distinct policy decision to have regulatory fee revenue cover the costs of issuing regulatory fees. In the case of the Educator Licensing, the Legislature reaffirmed this policy during the 2005 General Session.

The Analyst requested that the State Board of Education provide a fee schedule that would produce sufficient revenue to support these functions of the Educator Licensing Section without reinstating a state appropriation. Please refer to Attachment A for this fee schedule. The Analyst recommends that the Legislature adopt the fee schedule provided in Attachment A.

LEGISLATIVE ACTION

This section provides a guide of what actions might be taken if the Legislature wishes to adopt the recommendations made in this brief. The Analyst recommends that the Legislature consider adopting:

1. The fee schedule, provided in Attachment A, that provides sufficient revenue to support the functions of the USOE Educator Licensing Section without the reinstatement of state revenue.

since these functions are not directly tied to “educator licensing” that the use of fee revenue to cover these functions may not be appropriate.

Alternative Route to Licensure – the State Office of Education has requested a state appropriation to help oversee the Alternative Route to Licensure (ARL) program. The requested \$267,000 in ongoing Uniform School Fund revenue will be used by the USOE to ensure that all beginning ARL candidates have completed intensive training and provide supervision/mentoring of these candidates as they begin teaching. According to USOE all ARL candidates must have intensive supervision and mentoring in order to be reported as highly qualified.
