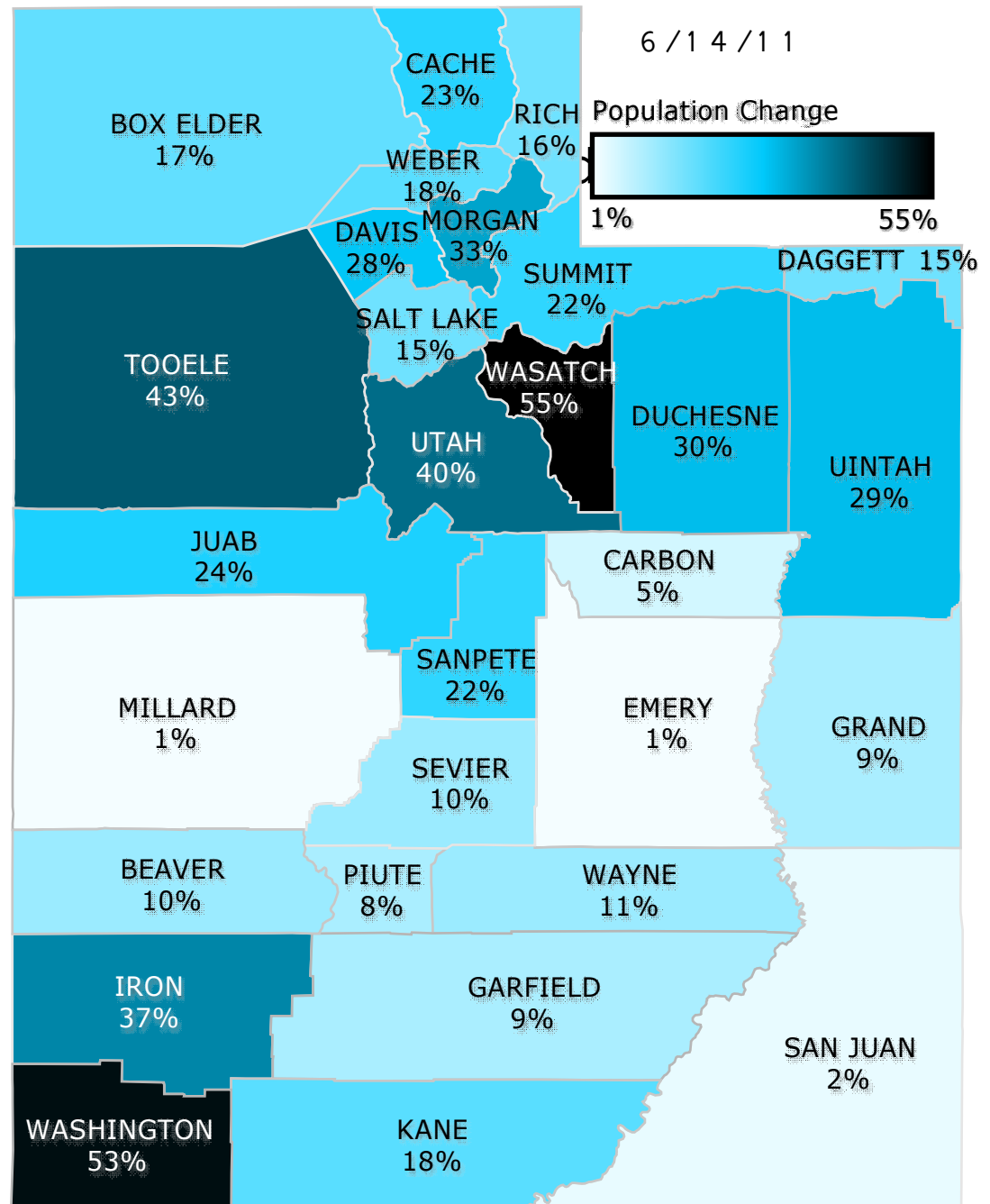

municipalities with biggest increase or decrease in representation

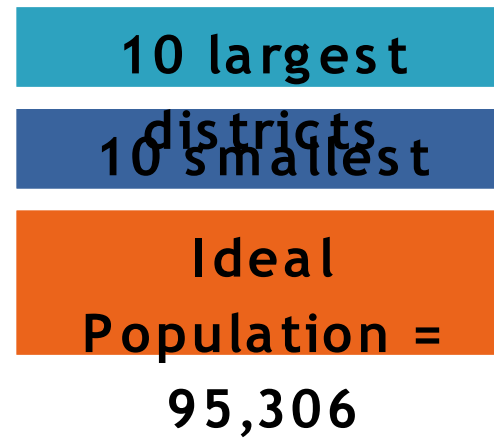

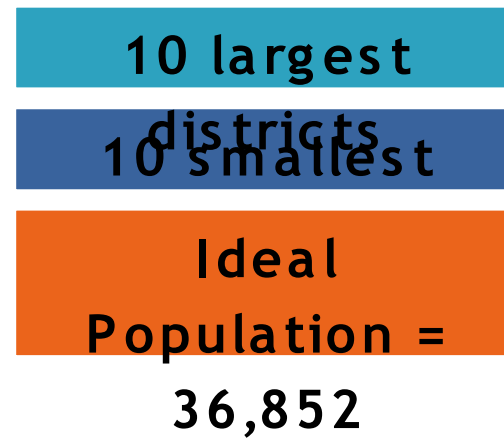

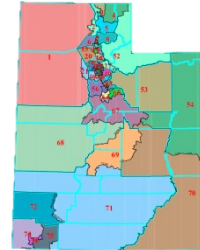
2010 Census Population for House Districts
