UTAH REDISTRICTING CONSTITUTIONAL MANDATE

"...the Legislature shall divide the state into congressional, legislative, and other districts..."

Utah Constitution - Article IX, Section 1



UTAH REDISTRICTING CONSTITUTIONAL MANDATE/DISTRICT TYPE

- +Congressional
- +Utah House of Representatives
- +Utah Senate
- +State Board of Education



UTAH REDISTRICTING CONSTITUTIONAL MANDATE

Why does the Utah State Legislature redraw district boundaries after every decennial census?

- State Constitutional Requirement
- One person One vote (Population change creates unequal populations within districts)
- To accommodate increase/decrease in the number of U.S. House Seats



UTAH REDISTRICTING POPULATION CHANGES


Population changes within the state

- Absolute numbers are less important than relative numbers
- Growth slower than average Size of districts will grow
- Growth faster than average Size of districts will shrink



POPULATION CHANGES


- Utah's overall population growth rate was 23.8%
- County growth rates ranged from 1% to
 55%







Population Increase Over or Under the State Average Growth Rate of 23.8% (2000 to 2010)




POPULATION 2010 CENSUS POPULATION FOR SENATE DISTRICTS

2011 REDISTRICTING PRINCIPLES

4 Congressional Districts. Ideal Size 690,971. Deviation +/- 0.1%

29 State Senate Districts. Ideal Size 95,306. Deviation +/- 3.5%

75 House Districts. Ideal Size 36,852. Deviation +/- 3.5%

15 State School Districts. Ideal Size 184,259. Deviation +/- 3.5
