ISSUE BRIEF

SUMMARY

As part of its FY 2015 budget submission, the Utah State Office of Rehabilitation (USOR) reported a nine year history of performance measures and benchmarking information, where it existed. This brief highlights changes from the previous year and identifies measures that have improved or declined by more than 5 percent.

LEGISLATIVE ACTION

ANALYSIS OF UTAH STATE OFFICE OF REHABILITATION PERFORMANCE MEASURES

The Utah State Office of Rehabilitation (USOR) has made no changes to the measures it presented in the 2013 General Session.

USOR measures showing greater than 5% improvement

- #1 Blind and Visually Impaired # of Children screened for vision problems (+70%)
- #4 Rehabilitation Counseling and Placement Change in # of employment outcomes (+7%)
- #10 Utah Center for Assistive Technology new clients served (+8%)

USOR measures showing greater than 5% decline

- #5 Rehabilitation Counseling and Placement % earnings increase weekly after closure (-20%)
- #8 Special Support Services Benefits Planning # of referrals (-7%)
- #9 Utah Center for Assistive Technology # of services provided (-13%)
- #11 Facilities Vocational Evaluation # of Evaluations performed (-8%)
- #13 Disability Determinations Initial claims processed (-12%)
- #14 Disability Determinations Continuing disability reviews processed (-8%)
- #15 Disability Determinations Total claims processed (-8%)
- #17 Services to the Hearing Impaired # of ASL certification exams given (-14%)
