



Straight FACTS

on UHCA'S funding request for ICFs/ID (serving those with intellectual disabilities.)

BACKGROUND:

- ◆ Utah's ICF/ID providers have not had a state general fund increase since 2003.

ITEMIZED BUDGET:

- ◆ Utah's ICF/ID providers need \$500,000 in on-going, state general fund dollars to fund a direct, pass-through wage increase.
- ◆ When Utah's ICF/ID providers receive the needed \$500,000 in on-going state general funds, approximately \$1,200.00 in federal matching funds will be generated, creating a total of \$1,700,000.
- ◆ This will provide critical funding, used exclusively for a direct, pass-through wage increase for the ICF/ID caregivers.

MEASURING SUCCESS:

When we receive the requested \$500,000:

Utah's ICF/ID providers, who provide 24-hour care to some of our state's most vulnerable citizens, will be able to increase the salaries of their staff who provide direct, hands-on care.
