TANF Report – 07/2014-06/2015

The Family Place offers a crisis/respice nursery and educational opportunities to families through TANF funding.

Stress levels of parents before and after services:

Of the respondents who received crisis services, 54% of respondents reported no stress or slightly stressed *before* crisis services, and 38% of families report somewhat to moderately stressed before receiving crisis services. 8% report being quite stressed before receiving services.

After receiving crisis services, 62% of families report being not at all stressed, and 23% of families report being slightly stressed after receiving crisis services. 15% of respondents reported being somewhat stressed.

If service ended would relationship with spouse become strained due to caregiving responsibilities?

If services ended, 80% of respondents reported that there would be a strain on the relationship with their spouse (40% reported that there would be somewhat strain; 20% reported that there would be quite a bit of strain and 20% reported that the strain on their relationship would be extreme).

If service was to end would there be any risk of neglect or child maltreatment?

- 67% of respondents reported that the program extremely reduces the risk of harm to children
- 33% of respondents reported that the program greatly reduces risk of harm to children

How service affected housing, child safety, employment, domestic violence, self-care, etc.

- 53% reported crisis services helping with, employment and self-care.
 - 100% of the families that reported crisis services helping with employment expressed it was extremely helpful in working on those issues.
 - 25% of families that reported help with self-care said that it was somewhat helpful
 - 25% of families that reported using crisis services for self-care stated that it helped quite a bit and the remaining
 - 50% of families using crisis for self-care reported it extremely helpful.
- 47% of families reported crisis services helping with parenting, medical, legal and other
 - 50% of the families that reported crisis services helping with medical issues expressed it was *quite a bit* helpful the other 50% said it was *extremely* helpful when dealing with medical issues.

- 50% of the families that reported crisis services helping with parenting expressed that it was *quite a bit helpful* while the other 50% reported it was *very* helpful in working on those issues.
- 100% of families that reported crisis services helping with legal or other said it was *extremely* helpful for working those issues.
