






SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLANS

- USBE issues grant after reviewing plans and signatures for compliance
- USBE reviews reports after the year closes
- Annual Compliance Reviews



- ▶ Local board may approve or reject but may not decide for council


Policy Input

We want local school board to take ownership...but not too much!




THE FUTURE: COUNCILS AND SCHOOL BOARDS
