 authorizes certain state agency fees;
 authorizes internal service fund rates;
 adjusts funding for the impact of Internal Service Fund rate changes; and,
 provides budget increases and decreases for other purposes as described.
Money Appropriated in this Bill:
This bill appropriates \$1,326,500 in operating and capital budgets for fiscal year 2018,
including:
► \$677,900 from the General Fund;
► \$129,700 from the Education Fund;
 \$518,900 from various sources as detailed in this bill.
This bill appropriates \$800 in expendable funds and accounts for fiscal year 2018.
This bill appropriates \$1,500 in business-like activities for fiscal year 2018.
This bill appropriates \$100 in fiduciary funds for fiscal year 2018.
