Purposes for Which Money Was Used

CHIP is a joint federal-state sponsored health insurance plan for uninsured children from households up to 200 percent of the federal poverty level (FPL). In SFY2016, CHIP provided services to 16,654 children (unduplicated). This line item funds both administrative and programmatic expenditures for CHIP.
