The above graph demonstrates the need statewide. If funds were made available to the counties, UAC would encourage the promotion of innovative and collaborative solutions. We would encourage the Legislature to include intent language with the appropriation similar to the following:

Establish a performance incentive grant program administrated by the Division of Substance Abuse and Mental Health for the purpose of treatment, coordination of treatment, and implementation of processes to promote the Justice Reinvestment Initiative. Funds shall be used to address substance use disorders and mental health issues in the JRI population. The Division shall allocate funds appropriated by the Legislature to programs and practices implemented by counties and local mental health authorities and local substance abuse authorities that reduce recidivism and reduce the number of offenders per capita who are incarcerated. The Division will establish a review committee that will address such issues as: establishing a performance matrix to evaluate grants, coordinate efforts between affiliate groups, and promote the general purposes of the Justice Reinvestment Initiative.
