


### LACK OF CAPACITY IN THESE PROGRAMS

**Medical Assisting:** Need to double enrollment to meet demand

**Pharmacy Technology:** Need to double enrollment to meet demand

**Practical Nurse:** Last year, nearly 570 applications but only 119 accepted and a fourth cohort is needed

**Surgical Technology:** Need to double enrollment to meet demand

### EXISTING DEFICIENCIES – INFRASTRUCTURE

**Labs not in proximity to classrooms (requires additional faculty):** Practical Nurse Program

**Bio-hazard/Bio-Storage Insufficient:** Combined with custodial storage and HVAC inadequate

**Dental Assisting:**

- Four operatories for 88 students (Dental Association accreditors recommend 6)
- Peer schools average 10 for the same student headcount
- Equipment and space over-utilized
