
SAFETY DURING CONSTRUCTION



WELCOME TO THE SITE

- Welcome to the site of the new Utah State Correctional Facility
- This new 4,000-bed facility will be built with state-of-the-art materials and workmanship
- Design will use the new direct supervision model, helping inmates build better social relationships and work towards normalization before integrating into society






DURING CONSTRUCTION

- More than 30 buildings
- Up to 1,200 construction professionals working on the site at the same time
- Primary focus is to get these workers home safely each night. Each person will be responsible for their Personal Safety Zone (30' circle)
- The following Safety
 Requirements will help us all
 accomplish that goal





SAFETY CHECK-IN AND ORIENTATION



PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT

- Personal Protective Equipment, or "PPE," is required for all who come onto the site
- PPE for visitors includes a hardhat, a safety vest, safety glasses and over-the-ankle shoes. Visitors will be provided this equipment by the Layton Okland Team.












PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT



- Subcontractors and others who will be working on site will be required to provide their own PPE that meets standards set by OSHA and Layton Okland
- All PPE equipment will be inspected and certified regularly




HOUSEKEEPING



- A clean work environment is a safe work environment and one that also leads to the best quality and productivity
- Each trade is responsible for keeping their storage and work areas organized and clean on a daily basis
- If a subcontractor fails to meet the housekeeping standards established by Layton Okland, the cleaning will be done by others, the costs for which will be deducted from the subcontract amount owing



POWER CORDS



- Cord inspections are required monthly, and a different colored tape is used each month to indicate that the cord has been inspected
- We embrace a "Nothing Hits the Floor" program for cords whereby hangers are installed to keep the floors free of tripping hazards and reducing cord damage







LADDERS LAST



- OSHA reports and studies indicate that one of the frequent contributors to recordable accidents and fatalities are ladders
- On this project, we are adopting a "Ladders Last" policy. If at all possible, we wish to discourage the use of ladders and replace their use with approved scaffolding.
- Layton Okland will provide access to multiple levels using approved stair scaffolding. If access to an area is not able to be accomplished by approved scaffold, we recommend a platform ladder be used. Ladder use is addressed in greater detail in our Site Specific Safety Plan.



SMOKING POLICY



- The Utah State Correctional Facility construction site is a Smoking Free zone
- This includes electronic devices
- There will be a designated smoking area off the site
- Chewing tobacco is prohibited on the site as well



OTHER RESTRICTIONS

- No alcohol
- No guns
- No music radios or earbuds

CARPOOLING

 Due to the remote location of the site, the volume of workers, and restricted access and parking, we strongly encourage carpooling





INCIDENT MANAGEMENT

- Procedures following an incident are outlined in our Site Specific Safety Plan and will be posted in several locations on the site. Our on-site Safety Managers will take the lead role in managing any incidents that may arise. It will be important for you to follow their instructions.
- Call 911 as needed
- Provide First Aid to the level of your training
- Notify member(s) of LOJV Safety Team
- Follow the instructions given by the LOJV Safety Management Team
