92 entity;

144 The Office of Legislative Research and General Counsel and the Office of the  
145 Legislative Fiscal Analyst shall jointly provide staff services to the committee.

147 **52-4-103. Definitions.**

148 As used in this chapter:

149 (1) "Anchor location" means the physical location from which:

150 (a) an electronic meeting originates; or

151 (b) the participants are connected.

152 (2) "Capitol hill complex" means the grounds and buildings within the area bounded  
153 by 300 North Street, Columbus Street, 500 North Street, and East Capitol Boulevard in Salt  
154 Lake City.

155 (3) "Convening" means the calling together of a public body by a person authorized to  
156 do so for the express purpose of discussing or acting upon a subject over which that public  
157 body has jurisdiction or advisory power.

454 (b) except as provided in Subsection (4)(c), receive and expend funds from a public or  
455 private source for any lawful purpose that is in the state's best interest; and  
456 (c) solicit and accept a contribution of money, services, or facilities from a public or  
457 private donor, but may not use the contribution for publicizing the exclusive interest of the  
458 donor.  
459 (5) Money received under Subsection (4)(c) shall be deposited in the General Fund as  
460 dedicated credits of the office.

461 (6) (a) The office shall obtain the advice of the board before implementing a change to  
462 a policy, priority, or objective under which the office operates.  
463 (b) Subsection (6)(a) does not apply to the routine administration by the office of  
464 money or services related to the assistance, retention, or recruitment of business, industry, or  
465 commerce in the state.

466 Section 9. **Sales tax exemption study.**

467 (1) The Utah State Tax Commission, in consultation with the Office of the Legislative  
468 Fiscal Analyst, shall study and prepare a report on the state revenue impacts of the sales and  
469 use tax exemptions under Section 59-12-104.

470 (2) The Utah State Tax Commission and Office of the Legislative Fiscal Analyst shall  
471 present the findings of the report to the Revenue and Taxation Interim Committee before  
472 November 30, 2017.

473 Section 10. **Effective date.**

474 If approved by two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, this bill takes effect  
475 upon approval by the governor, or the day following the constitutional time limit of Utah  
476 Constitution, Article VII, Section 8, without the governor's signature, or in the case of a veto,  
477 the date of veto override.
