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




- Forecasts and simulation




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
Direct Defense employment has been fairly stable in Utah for 15 years with a slight decline in military







Utah's non-defense employment has grown faster than its direct defense employment.






Utah Defense Industry Total Economic Impact, 2015






Utah Defense Industry Economic Impact: \$9.2 Billion GDP

Fiscal Impacts: The defense sector directly and indirectly generated \$146.3 million in net state revenue.




