

Impact Assessment

- Quality improvement in health care can be triggered by many factors, including a desire for professionalism, pressure by payers, risk management, and patient demand. The publication of direct comparisons from an unbiased, common data source is arguably helpful in multiple ways. It is possible that the main impact will come from the desire for professionalism - each provider will know how they compare to their peers and may be motivated to improve. It is also possible that market forces will use this same information to spur improvement, such as by payers establishing financial incentives for providers to improve based on the comparisons or by patients shifting demand toward higher quality providers.
- Quality improvement may be self-motivated and due to financial incentives from payers than by patient behavior. Whereas institutions have resources to pay attention to quality measures, patients rarely do and this information is not likely to get into the hands of many consumers at the time they are making decisions.
- There is some potential for that to change in the future with technological advances, but at this time the direct effect of consumers is likely smaller than other driving factors.
