

Concealed Firearm Permits (CFP) Fact Sheet – June 20, 2017 Utah Bureau of Criminal Identification, Department of Public Safety


Pursuant to Utah Code Ann. § 53-5-701 et seq., the Utah Bureau of Criminal Identification (BCI) is responsible for issuing concealed firearm permits. The following summarizes the current status, including historic trends, of this program:




Fiscal Year 2017 looks like it will end with about a 21,000 decrease from fiscal year 2016 for the number of new applications received.




This graph shows application numbers during the past 1½ years.



TOTAL CONCEALED FIREARM PERMITS, UTAH VS. NON-UTAH



The total number of valid permits counted from 1994 to the end of May 30, 2017, shows that the majority of applications have come from non-Utah Residents <u>459,674</u> compared to Utah residents <u>247,802</u>. Three additional reporting periods were researched to be able to reflect any overall changes and also show any ongoing shifts between the two groups. During the fiscal year 2015, 23% (17,580) of permit applications were submitted from Utah applicants and 77% (58,855) are from non-Utahns. In FY 2016, 33% (31,602) of permit applications were submitted from Utah applicants and 67% (63,602) are from non-Utahns. As of May 30, 2017 in FY 2017, 37% (27,457) of permit applications were submitted from Utah applicants and 67% (46,297) are from non-Utahns.



Research of total concealed firearm instructors was conducted on fiscal years 2010 – 2017. Current research for fiscal year **2017** reflects **759** certified instructors **in Utah** and **1,730** instructors **outside of Utah**.
