
IMPROVING THE HEALTH OF UTAH'S FAMILIES

A Demonstrated Need For Expanding Family Planning Coverage

Utah's experience

- ~650,000 women of reproductive age in Utah
 - ~212,250 Utah women in need of publicly funded family planning services
- Utah Medicaid funded 1:3 births in the state
- Medicaid largely unavailable for non-pregnant, childless adults
 - Many of these women go on Medicaid when they do become pregnant

What is LARC?

- Long-acting reversible contraception (LARC)
 - Intrauterine Devices (IUD)
 - Contraceptive Implants
- Designed for extended use (5 years -12 years)
- 20X more effective than birth control pills
- Can cost up to \$1,200 out-of-pocket



Non-hormonal IUD





Local Demonstration



Demonstration in Colorado

- Medicaid avoided ~\$79 million (5-years)
- High-risk births declined by 24%
- Abortion rates fell:
 - 34% among 15-19-year-olds
 - 18% among 20-24-year-olds
- Infant enrollment in WIC declined 25%




Medicaid Expansion & Medicaid Family Planning

State Decisions on ACA Medicaid Expansion and Medicaid Family

Planning Programs, January 2016

Utah is 1 of 7 states without expanded family planning coverage



Family Planning State Plan Amendment (SPA)

- Income-based eligibility
- Services qualify for a 90% federal match
- Maximizes flexibility

- Improved birth outcomes
- Reduced abortions



Expanding coverage to 8,000* Utahns could prevent

- •2,000 unintended pregnancies
- •990 unplanned births covered by Medicaid
- •680 abortions

\$10,211,120 maternal & birth costs saved +\$327,050 miscarriage and ectopic cost saved -\$935,500 family planning SPA cost*

\$9,602,670 Net Savings

Families Win

- Increased postsecondary education
- Improved employment rates
- Increased earning
- More enduring marriages
- Breaking the cycle of intergenerational poverty



Taxpayers and State Budgetary Win

- \$7.09 saved for every public \$1 spent
- Budget neutrality anticipated after 2 years



Pro-Family Planning

- Prioritize a Medicaid Family Planning Waiver/SPA
- Support legislation that removes barriers to LARC (IUDs and Implants)
- Ensure coverage of all FDA approved contraceptive methods
