

Intergenerational Poverty Interventions Budget Review

What is it? Why is the State involved?

The Intergenerational Poverty Interventions program provides afterschool education services that help students affected by intergenerational poverty achieve academic success. In awarding grants, the Utah State Board of Education (USBE) considers the percentage of a local education agency’s (LEA) students that are classified as children affected by intergenerational poverty; the level of administrative support and leadership at an eligible LEA to effectively implement, monitor, and evaluate the program; and an LEA's commitment and ability to work with the Department of Workforce Services (DWS), the Department of Health, the Department of Human Services, and the juvenile courts to provide services to the LEA's eligible students. The grants aim to improve the academic achievement of students affected by intergenerational poverty and help break the cycle of poverty.

Organization

The Utah State Board of Education administers the Intergenerational Poverty Interventions program. It awards grants to LEAs through a competitive process.

Funding

- The appropriation for the program in FY 2018 is \$1.0 million ongoing.
- Funding can be used for new or existing after-school programs.
- This funding has been supplemented with federal Child Care Development Fund (CCDF) funding from DWS for four of the selected LEAs in 2014 and two of the selected LEAs in 2015. DWS used the CCDF funding to fund two additional LEAs in rural school districts in 2016.
