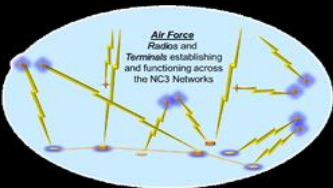

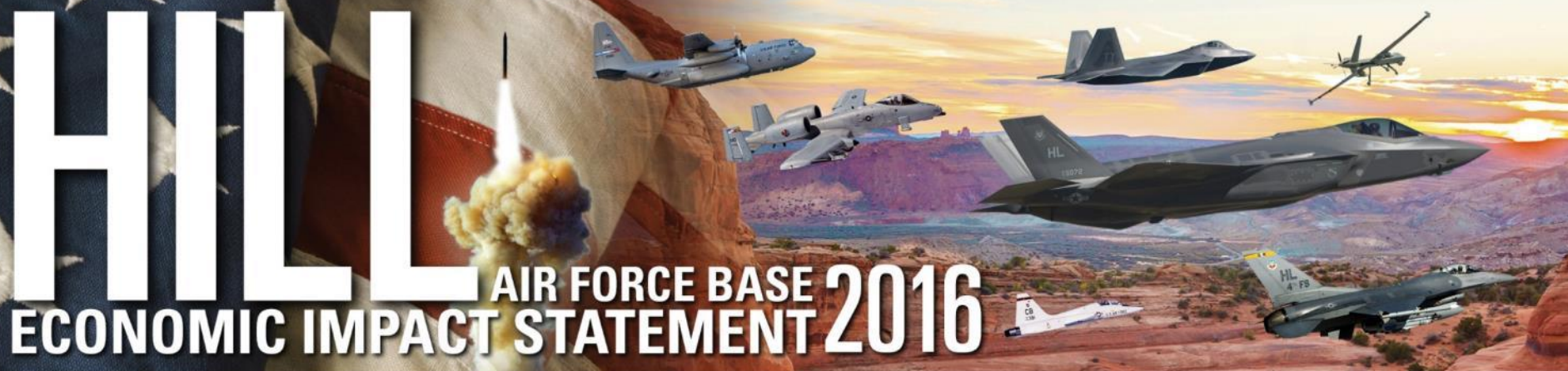

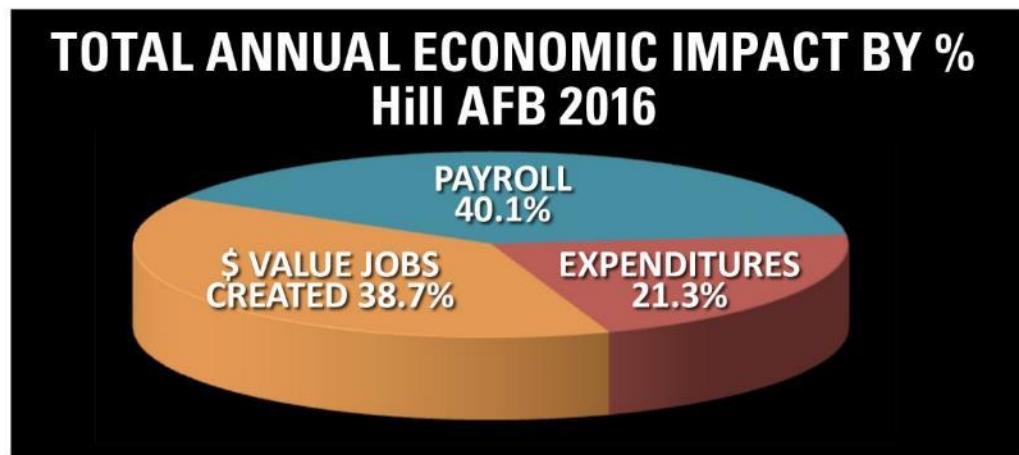

## At a Glance

There are 27,365 total personnel within Hill Air Force Base, including 5,636 military, 5,591 military dependents and 16,138 civilians. Hill AFB has an annual federal payroll of \$1.34 billion and annual expenditures of \$710 million. Annually, Hill AFB creates approximately \$1.29 billion in jobs created with a total of **\$3.34 billion** in total annual economic impact.
