

# County jail risk and needs screening program.


The statewide risk and needs screening instrument assists jail staff with offender management; screens out low risk offenders; and provides information on referrals for substance use and mental health evaluation.




# Close to 70% of arrestees are moderate or high risk.

More than two-thirds of Utah's arrestees are moderate or high risk, with close to half being in need of a further assessment for a substance use disorder.

### Risk Level Breakdown





# Drug and property arrestees have a similar risk/need profile.


Individuals being arrested for a drug or property crime share a similar likelihood of being high risk/high need (for substance use).

% High Risk/High Need (SU) by Offense Type




## The number of justice involved clients admitted to substance use treatment has increased post JRI.

While the number of justice involved clients admitted to treatment has increased since the implementation of JRI, the number of justice involved clients served has remained relatively trendless.




The number of justice involved clients receiving mental health treatment increased in FY17.



# Utah's prison population has significantly declined.


Utah's actual prison population is 18 percent less than projected without reforms and has in recent months reached its HB348 projection line.

## Prison Population Projections




## Supervision population increased at a similar rate pre- and post-JRI.

Overall, the AP&P supervision population had been growing steadily prior to the reforms. This is mostly due to a slightly decreased growth in the probation population. The parole population has experienced a slight increase.
