## St. Vincent de Paul Dining Hall

The St. Vincent de Paul Dining Hall serves two hot, nutritious meals to homeless and low-income individuals in need Monday - Saturday and an evening meal on Sundays. 1,000 meals are served each day.



## Weigand Homeless Resource Center

The Weigand Homeless Resource Center offers a safe place for individuals struggling with chronic homelessness to receive case management and skills training to help them reach self-sufficiency. On average, over 500 individuals visit the facility daily.



## Volunteer


